THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the 50th annual conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations assembled at Thief River Falls, Minnesota June 12-15, 2012.

We are gathered this year under the theme of JUBILEE supported by the verses of Psalm 118:23 & 24. "This is the Lord's doing and it is marvelous in our eyes. This is the day which the Lord has made; we will rejoice and be glad in it"

This conference is historic in that we celebrate 50 years of AFLC fellowship, worship and ministry. It is a week wherein we have opportunity to look back, to give thanks to our Heavenly Father and to look forward with expectancy to what He holds in store for days and years ahead. As found in Leviticus 25, JUBILEE was a year long celebration which followed 49 years in which people labored to raise crops and then on the 50th year they celebrated as slaves that were set free and family property that had been sold could be restored to its original owners.

In the New Testament the year of JUBILEE is spoken of as fulfilled in the gospel as people are set free from the bondage of sin and liberated as sons of God. In Luke chapter 4 Jesus entered the synagogue on the Sabbath and was given the book of the prophet Isaiah and asked to read. He did so reading from Isaiah 61: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He has anointed me to preach good news to the poor, He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord.." then He closed the book, gave it back to the attendant, and said "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing."

And so we celebrate this year of JUBILEE as a church which has experienced and proclaimed His message of Good News, release from captivity, sight recovered and liberty as found in God's Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. To Him be glory both now and forevermore.

In preparing for this conference, I have again been blessed by the cooperation and generosity of our host congregation. To Pastor Greg Schram and Mr. Glen Esby who have served as Co-chairmen of this conference committee we extend our thanks and express our appreciation for the fine and thorough planning and work that you have done together with your people to prepare for our time in Thief River Falls.

It is my purpose in this report to draw our attention to NEEDS of the AFLC. There is always a tendency on our part to declare as need something we

desire or want rather than something that is absolutely essential to our goal of establishing Free and Living Lutheran Congregations. To that end our God has been ever faithful, and over these 50 years literally hundreds of men, women and youth have faithfully served. Thanks be to Him that has called us and sent us to minister to one another and to reach out to the world in which we live with the wonderful good news of the Gospel.

NEEDS OF THE EARLY DAYS

A review of minutes of the convening conference which was held right here in Thief River Falls on October 25-28, 1962 reminds us of some very basic needs which were expressed and addressed. Our founding fathers were adamant about continuing the tradition and conviction of the Lutheran Free Church. Their Church was being threatened by such things as neo-orthodoxy, World Council of Churches, liberal theology, a lowering of the standard for Godly living, open attack on the Word of God and many other vital concerns. They sought the direction and power of the Word to answer their questions and meet their needs and the Lord has been faithful in doing that these 50 years and will continue to do that for us as long as He tarries and finds us faithful.

Two of the needs that early band of believers addressed were the need for a seminary where men could be properly instructed and prepared for serving as pastors in the AFLC and for the work of missions both at home and abroad. Our seminary opened its doors in the fall of 1964, and our Mission department began in April of 1963. In both of those needs the Lord provided the resources, the inspiration and the people to serve and our schools and missions continue to prepare young men and women to reach out with a Word which is His power unto salvation. May that never change.

There was also the need for documents which clearly identified who they were and what they stood for. The Guiding Principles of the Lutheran Free Church were adopted and the Declaration of Faith was presented and approved as a temporary document which was later approved and still stands as our *Declaration of Faith*. Committees and Boards were elected and a new church quickly took on structure and organization which has been maintained and expanded to meet the needs of a growing AFLC.

NEEDS OF THE INTERVENING DAYS

As the new church grew so also the needs increased. At the beginning the AFLC was made up of five boards, one committee and two corporations. Today we have five major corporations, several sub corporations with at least 15 boards, committees and commissions that are selected by the annual conference to give direction to the ministries of the AFLC. We have grown from

54 congregations to 287. Here at the congregational level is what we refer to as the "cutting edge" of our church. It is in the local congregation where people gather for Worship, for teaching and study of the Word; for ministry of Word and Sacrament to hungry souls. People involved in real everyday experiences work together to support, uphold and challenge one another in regard to spiritual faith and growth. They join together to share their faith with neighbors and friends as well as with others in foreign lands. This work of ministry and missions must carry on so that future generations may have the same opportunity as we to hear the Word and know the Savior.

Our expanding campus has grown in number of buildings from three when the property on East Medicine Lake Boulevard was initially purchased to the 11 that presently accommodate our headquarters, schools, staff and seminary families. There are well over 200 people that come and go on our campus each week. I do not take lightly the privilege it is to be part of our campus family. The oneness of mind and spirit as well as the common goal of serving the Lord and the His people from all across our fair country as well as those in far away lands is a tremendous privilege and opportunity.

We live in a day and age that is filled with all kinds of new thought, new direction, new and advancing technology, changing morals and ethics, increasing population, crime, violence, break up of marriage and families and the list goes on. It sometimes seems as everything is changing. In the midst of this our beloved AFLC has been and continues to be faced with the challenge to maintain course and direction. The course and direction were carefully spelled out 50 years ago in the Declaration of Faith and The Fundamental Principles as adopted. Our founding fathers believed that the course of this new church that was developing must have its roots firmly planted in the Word of God. From that Word came the direction for a fresh start, and from that Word we continue to take our marching orders. We hold that Word as Inspired, Inerrant and Infallible. It is not in need of man's reason, experience or interpretation. It is to that Word that we cling; it is in this Word that we find hope for this life and for eternity; it is in this Word that we find all the resources of Life which He has promised. The needs of these intervening days which number 18,250, have been and continue to be rooted and grounded in His Holy Word. To God be the glory both now and forevermore.

As this conference continues we will hear from each of our ministries as to how the Lord of the Church continues to lead and bless and build His Church.

NEEDS OF THE 21St CENTURY AND BEYOND

The Psalmist in Psalm 119:105 says "Thy Word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path." His words remind me that the Light provided to us is

Jesus, the Light of the World, and that we have in Him what is needed for each step on the path which we follow as we walk with Him. We do not know what life will bring as we round the next turn or crest the next hill in this journey of life, but thanks be to God we have His Son to whom we can entrust ourselves and the future of our AFLC. He not only knows the way, but He is the Way, and He will bring us safely home.

There will always be needs, and in Philippians 4:19 we are promised "my God will supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." As we celebrate His faithfulness and His provision for the 50 years gone by, we are confident that our basic needs as individuals and as an AFLC will continually be met by Him that has called us.

Our basic, daily needs have not changed in 50 years and I am certain they will not change in the days and years to come. His continual presence, guidance, inspiration, provision, grace and mercy will always be our need. As we carry on into the future with the same calling we have had over the past 50 years, the course and direction will not change provided we continue to hold fast to His Word as the authority in all matters of faith and life. We shall depend on Him to bring daily refreshing, renewal and revival to us and to future generations

Many of those that were the first leaders of the AFLC back in 1962 have gone on to their eternal reward and are resting in His eternal peace. The baton has been and continues to be passed from generation to generation. Our people have sought His will as leaders have been elected and appointed to serve. At this time next year you will elect a new president. The date of birth on my driver's license is only one indication that it is time for me to step down and pass the baton to a younger generation. I call on you as a church to, again, be praying for God's provision for this need of the AFLC.

NEED TO GIVE THANKS

There is always a need to give thanks. First and foremost I give thanks and praise to our God. His faithfulness never ceases to amaze me. I can only say "Why does he bless me so?" I know the answer and have experienced it over and over in my relationship with Him; I know He loves me so much that He has made provision for me to walk with Him now and to be with Him for eternity. Thank you Father.

He has also given me friends for whom I am so very grateful. My dear travel and ministry companion is at the top of the list; Thank you Faith for all you are to me and to our children and for all you do for me and for so many others. Thank you to Karen Floan and Pastor Dick for your faithful service to the Lord

as we have worked together. For all of the rest of my co-workers on our Plymouth campus I give thanks to our Lord for the privilege of serving with you and for the special times of fellowship, laughter, tears, and many other blessings that you bring to me as we serve together.

To the pastors and congregations of the AFLC, thank you for the many times and places when we have had opportunity to join our hearts in fellowship, ministry and His blessings.

We are a family. You are all so very important and the oneness we share in Christ makes each day a special blessing. Thank you Father for these friends.

OUR GREATEST NEED

Yes, we as a church have many needs; And the greatest need we have is Jesus. He is here today as He was here in 1962, and He has given us His promise that by His Word and His Spirit, He is with us today, and that He will return for His bride. As our theme verses state "This is His doing and it is marvelous in our eyes." And so we sing our prayer to Him with the words of the hymn "Lead On, O King Eternal."

Lead On, O King Eternal

Lead on, O King eternal! The day of march has come. Henceforth in fields of conquest Your tents will be our home. Through days of preparation Your grace has made us strong, And now O King eternal, We lift our battle song.

REPORT OF THE CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE

We are truly blessed as individuals, congregations, and the fellowship we call, The Association of Free Lutheran Congregations. This is the Lord's church. We eagerly await the Lord's direction in future ministry. There are very few of the original leaders of our AFLC who are still with us. Most have gone to their eternal home. Fifty years from now, most of us in this assembly will have joined our forefathers. What will be said of us? Will we also be remembered as the ones who were faithful to the Word of God, who loved the Lord and his church, who believed that with God all things are possible, who looked to Jesus for direction, and then were counted as faithful workers in the Kingdom? May we hear the words from our Lord, "Well done, good and faithful servant. Enter into the rest of your master."

AFLC DIRECTOR OF DEVELOPMENT

REPORT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF INSTITUTIONAL CHAPLAINCY

To 50th Annual Conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations held June 12-15, 2012 at Thief River Falls Minnesota.

Greetings from the AFLC Department of Institutional Chaplaincy. Institutional Chaplaincy is a unique ministry within the AFLC where God has called pastors to serve in Hospitals, Long term care facilities, Hospice and now included within our department are Prison Chaplains.

Chaplaincy is more than going to visit people once in a while, but it is a walking with people as they meet the challenges of life. The people we come in contact with are, for the most part, more aware of their spiritual, physical and emotional needs than ever before. In the hospital, the chaplain is called or paged to come anytime someone has a trauma such as a motorcycle accident or the patient suffers a stroke, has cancer, a heart attack or is facing surgery. Many times an instant bond is developed when the chaplain arrives and the patient and or the family recognizes the chaplain is there to bring God's presence and offer prayer and scripture. The chaplain is recognized as a friend and God opens doors for ministry to take place. In all the areas of ministry, chaplains are not trying to replace the home church pastor but rather to be an extension of the church and chaplains seek to strengthen a person's relationship with God's church.

In long term care, the chaplain is there to help residents with the transition into the nursing home. By the time a person enters a nursing home, their health has declined, they have experienced the death of loved ones. They are not able to take care of themselves. Everything in their world has changed. Their faith in God is the one factor that has not changed and the chaplain seeks to reach out with God's love and care. Many times the residents will ask for prayer and scripture for strength. They may have lost control over many aspects of their lives, but their relationship with God is the stabilizing factor that remains. The chaplain is there to be God's hand reaching out to His people to help them to meet the challenges and be a friend. There is a wonderful respect from the residents for the person who points to God. At our facilities, we have a wonderful program called End of Life protocol where, as the person nears the end of their earthly life, we provide many extra measures of comfort such as a Bible, prayers, scripture verses that speak of God's preparations for them as well as refreshments. The chaplain makes regular visits and we have a program called "Abiders". Abiders are trained volunteers that will come and sit with a resident during the resident's last days at times when family is not able to be there.

We do our utmost to help the resident and family members gain comfort and peace through the provisions of God. It is truly a day by day walk with God.

The Hospice chaplain serves as a connection between the hospital, the nursing home and a person's personal home. The Hospice patient will have a terminal diagnosis and a life expectancy of up to 6 months. The chaplain serves as a part of the hospice team that determines a person's needs and serves as an advocate for the individual and their family. In hospice, the family and the individual's needs are taken into consideration to keep the individual as comfortable as possible and also to help the family in their journey through grief and loss. With the hospice patient's permission, the hospice chaplain makes regular visits to see both family and the terminal individual and to recognize how they can help in this walk of life. The hospice program also includes bereavement care for 13 months following the death of their loved one. The walk of earthly life that God gives each of us is an opportunity for the chaplain to walk with them and God works through the chaplains to help people live life to its fullest.

Association Retreat Center (ARC) Annual Report

To the 50th Annual Conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Churches gathered at Our Savior's Lutheran Church, Thief River Falls, MN; greetings from the Board of Directors and staff of the Association Retreat Center. A special thank you to our hosts, the members of Our Savior's Lutheran Church. May God bless you for your willingness and dedication in coordinating this conference June 12-15, 2012.

The AFLC-ARC theme verse for 2012 is "Follow me and I will make you become fishers of men." Mark 1:17. In 2011, the ARC hosted over 10,000 people, which is down slightly from previous years.. From over 140 church groups, many people (once again) accepted Christ as their Lord and Savior or re-dedicated their Christian walk!! This testifies to God's use of the ARC as a "mission field in reverse"; allowing a variety of cultures and church bodies to use our facility and to spread the good news of Jesus Christ.

The continued decline in the economy affected ARC camper income. A thank you to all AFLC members who attended camp – as AFLC camp revenue increased by 5% from 2010. A small decline in attendance from other churches created a small loss in "the other" churches revenue. The last 5 years, non-faith based groups such as support groups, physically impaired groups, medical support, crafting groups, band camps and family re-unions, have seen the largest decline in revenue. We so appreciate the financial support of our AFLC members. 2011 provided approximately 63% of the most excellent gifting we received at the onset of our BOLD campaign in 2010. Due to previous stated factors, we were left with a shortfall. Therefore, the ARC Board was forced to consider a realignment of staff. We also have been unable to make a significant impact on debt reduction plans. Please pray God will provide wisdom for the ARC Board, Corporation and staff in working through difficulties and pursuing a plan as He sees fit.

Upcoming building improvements and volunteer efforts will continue to focus on capital preservation projects. New and more extensive projects will be completed as funds become available. A re-direction of marketing will focus on the use of technology to reach prospective customers. Please pray for effective website, e-mail, phone texts and website marketing.

Our vision to reach the local community is continuing and expanding. In addition to the Local Boy Scout Troop, 4-H, play clubs, athletic teams and other community groups, the Sea Cadet program is now coming on a monthly basis. A second run of the theatre production of The Christmas Boy hosted nearly 1,000 guests to hear the gospel message of the Christmas Boy!

Twenty three local vendors highlighted the third annual Christmas festival and craft fair which also included hayrides, kid's activities and food.

We thank Mr. Ivar Berge, Mr. Roger Timm and Mr. Alan Anderson for their

many years of service to the ARC Board of Directors. We welcome Mr. Denis Parsley, Mr. Dan Ballmann and Mr. Roger Van Someren as their replacements. Please pray for God's blessing on all these men.

REPORT OF THE AFLC BUDGET ANALYSIS COMMITTEE

To the Fiftieth Annual Conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations assembled in Thief River Falls, MN, June 12-15, 2012.

The Budget Analysis Committee (BAC) met at the AFLC Headquarters on April 13-14 to review the proposed budgets and financial conditions of the various departments of the AFLC. We met with representatives of World Missions, Home Missions, AFLBS, AFLTS, Youth, Parish Education, Evangelism, and the Coordinating Committee. BAC members present were Mr. Bob Dietsche, Pastor Ken Hart, Mr. Kevin Olson and Mr. Kevin O'Neil.

PURPOSE

The BAC is elected by and reports to the Annual Conference. The purpose of the BAC is to review the finances and budget proposals of each department requesting a subsidy from the Annual Conference and to report our findings to the Conference.

The goals of the BAC continue to be:

- 1. Consistent and accurate budget projections,
- 2. Fairness to all ministries in the budgetary process,
- 3. Clear and concise reporting of ministry finances to the Annual Conference,
- 4. Promotion of stewardship and financial efficiency, and
- 5. Systematic improvement of the budgetary process.

Under the budgeting system the various ministries develop and present their budget requests without any external constraint, balancing anticipated giving with their perceived ministry needs. The proposed subsidy amounts are not developed by the BAC. The job of projecting consistent and accurate budgets is primarily the task of the ministries themselves with final oversight ultimately resting with you, the Annual Conference.

In line with a 2010 Conference resolution, progress has been made toward the goal of improving the budget reporting system. Work remains to be done and we feel confident more progress will be made this year.

Looking back at the finances from 2011 we were very grateful for God's generous provision for the works of the AFLC. Support for the common works increased by 7%. This is encouraging given the difficult economy. The actual giving reached 92% of the 2011 approved subsidy level, which was the same percentage as 2010. Even with the gap between approved subsidy and actual giving, all of the ministries took care to stay within their means.

When comparing the proposed subsidy requests to the previous years' receipts we have seen budgets proposing increases of 16% for 2010, 24% for 2011, 22% for

2012 and 15% for 2013. Overall, the ministries seem to be adjusting their budgets to better reflect what they have actually received in the past. However, the proposed increases are still greater than the typical year-over-year increase in actual historical giving. We would encourage the ministries to remain diligent in their spending and remember the call to be good stewards of the gifts given them by the church.

The BAC has worked to provide to you, the Annual Conference, a clear view of the finances of each ministry so that you can provide informed guidance to the ministries going forward. We would remind the Conference that your approval of the subsidy requests for each ministry represent the approval of the stated budget and direction of that ministry, and the pledge of the larger church body to support each ministry to that level. We would strongly encourage the Annual Conference to give prayerful consideration before approving the budgets here presented.






- AFLTS is requesting a subsidy support increase of 26% and AFLBS an increase of 9% over 2011 actual receipts.
- The Bible School is increasing room and board by \$150 per student per year.The increase is primarily due to rising food prices.
- 3. The Seminary is increasing tuition by \$10 per credit.
- 4. The School Board has approved a 1% salary increase.
- There are many maintenance projects that need completion but are not addressed in the budget. Specifically, energy efficient windows and boiler replacement.






EVANGELISM

- Evangelism is requesting a subsidy support increase of 14.7% over 2011 actual receipts.
- 2. Most of the increase in expected expenditures is related to special projects, including Red Thread retreats and revising of discipleship manuals.




GENERAL FUND

- The Coordinating Committee is requesting a subsidy support increase of 24% over 2011 actual receipts.

 - c. Additional IT/Web support costs




YOUTH

- 3. A special project, that is not part of the budget, is the training of youth workers.




WORLD MISSIONS

- 1. World Missions is requesting a subsidy support decrease of 5% over 2011 actual receipts.

- The Ambassador Institute continues to develop and is on track to receive only 20% of their support from the World Mission Department.
- World Missions received a large legacy in 2011. They gave 10% of that legacy toward the expenses of the Director of Development.




HOME MISSIONS

- Home Missions is requesting a subsidy support increase of 26% over 2011 actual receipts.
- 2. A 1.5% salary increase is in the budget.
- 3. Other increases are due to:
 - a. Increase in utility costs in Alaska
 - b. Building a garage for KAKN vehicles
 - c. 2 new prospective Home Mission starts
- Home Missions received a large legacy in 2011, 35% of which was designated toward the Alaska work.



PARISH EDUCATION

- 1. Parish Education is requesting a subsidy support increase of 31% over 2011 actual receipts.
- 2. The Parish Education Board is budgeting to add an additional full time staff member. Several projects are fully funded but they lack the staff to complete the work.



CLOSING

As we examine the proposed budgets we are encouraged by the fact that the various ministries are taking care to operate within their means. We feel it is prudent to remind you that there is an increase of over \$400,000 dollars in the proposed budgets of the combined ministries, when compared to 2011 actual receipts. We would remind the Conference that in approving these budgets you are, by faith, pledging to support the ministries to that level and are giving the approval of the larger church body to the goals and directions of each of the ministries.

AFLC BENEFITS BOARD CHAIRMAN

Our Mission: To help AFLC pastors, missionaries, and lay employees to serve Christ by providing:

- A well managed retirement plan so they might have a stream of income in retirement years.
- Affordable and adequate insurance product to protect them in the case of a severe loss.
- Emergency assistance (by making distributions from the H.I.S. fund) to those who have special emergency financial needs.

The Benefits Board continues to monitor a series of benefits that are made available to our Pastors and employees of the AFLC.

- Life Insurance used to assist their loved ones in the event of an untimely death.
- Long Term Disability when they find themselves in a position where they cannot work due to an injury or sickness.
- HRA accounts used to assists members with potential out of pocket costs on their own personally designed Medical Insurance Plans.
- 401(k) Retirement plan used to aid our Pastors and employees with the ability to use tax favored dollars to save for their retirement.

With a number of changes that have taken place over the past several years within our 401(k) product 2011 was a year in which we concentrated on investment options within the 401(k) and as this economy continues to create so much uncertainty one of our major changes in Investment options was to add 5 asset allocation funds with a wide degree of asset allocation within each respective option. These options were designed to give our participates the option of selecting one investment option within the 401(k) put that one selection would allow their retirement assets to be diversified across the complete asset classes offered within the plan. With improvements offered on the website each participant can use tools on the website to assist them as to their investment temperament. For so many participants, yes the investment options picked are important, but we find so many times the bigger question is how much do I need to retire and how much do I need to put away to reach that goal. Again website tools can assist with those questions as well. We pray our participants will take advantage of these tools.

The Benefits Board will continue to monitor each and every fund offered in the retirement plan throughout the year. We monitor our current offerings with all funds available to us within our Hartford product. We also strive to offer investment options in all the various asset classes to allow each plan

participant to find investment vehicle to match their personal investment temperament.

As we move forward we will be using the website to assist in getting out timely and useful information too all our plan participants and especially the Pastors. It would be great if we could get in front of each and every one of out Pastors every year but distance causes us to not be able to accomplish this. Our plan agent, Tom Johnston, continues to make himself available at all the major AFLC gatherings including the Pastor retreats. ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES AFLC Seminary and Bible School

To the Fiftieth Annual Conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations assembled in Thief River Falls, MN, June 13-15, 2012.

In Galatians 5:13 we read, "For you were called to freedom, brethren, only do not turn your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another." The calling of every believer is to serve, especially in the congregation where the Spirit of God places him or her. This is the very reason for the existence of our schools. The seminary and Bible School were established to train servants for our congregations who are grounded in the Word, theologically sound, and spiritually alive.

Following the guidance of the Annual Conference and the Schools Corporation, we are working to develop and strengthen the schools so that they are even more effective in training servants for the congregations. Specific areas we are focusing on for development are student enrollment, scholarships, accreditation, and facilities.

STUDENT ENROLLMENT:

Several years ago the conference challenged us with the vision of having "one student from every congregation" enrolled in the Bible School. Student recruitment and development has taken on an added importance as the number of students has continued to decline. Mr. Chad Friestad, the Student Development Director is working in this area, and we are looking forward to increased enrollment as the result of his work. But remember that students are best sent not simply recruited. Enrollment in the Bible School will go forward as pastors and congregations, convinced of the benefits of the Bible School for their young people, work together with the school to encourage their students to attend. In the next few years, we hope to increase enrollment at the Bible School to our current capacity, which is approximately 150 students.

SCHOLARSHIPS:

During the 2011-2012 school year the Seminary awarded \$91,951 in scholarships and grants, or approximately \$4500 per student. Much of this was from funds generated through student housing fees which are returned to the students in the form of tuition grants, and the rest through endowment funds established by congregations and individuals in the AFLC. Through the same period the Bible School has awarded \$36,280 in scholarships and grants, or approximately \$330 per student.

As we can see, there is need to increase the available scholarship funds for the Bible School. In order to make the school available and affordable for all who desire to attend, we have developed a three point program to develop the scholarship funds. First, we encourage the congregations of the AFLC to establish scholarship funds for their own youth who attend the Bible School. Congregational Scholarship have proven to be a great source of encouragement for students to attend the Bible School, as a large percentage of our students come from congregations that have established scholarship

programs. Second, we have created the S-400 program. In this program we are seeking 400 individuals or congregations that will make the commitment to give \$250 per year for student scholarships. At the time of this writing, 95 individuals have signed on for S-400, and the Bible School has received \$20,230 in Scholarship funds from the program! Third, we have approved the addition of a \$5 million permanent endowment scholarship fund to the Vision program. This will provide an ongoing source of funds for future scholarships.

ACCREDITATION:

In response to resolutions from the Schools Corporation and the Annual Conference, we have been actively pursuing accreditation for our schools through the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS). Dr. Monseth, Pastor Rolf and I attended the TRACS Conference in November. We returned with the recommendation that, although the accreditation process requires a commitment of time and resources, the outcome will be beneficial to our schools, and we should proceed. We are confident that accreditation through TRACS will not require changing our current program, nor will it compromise our commitment to our heritage and core values.

We believe the accreditation process will assist us in developing greater academic excellence in both the Seminary and the Bible School and thus deliver a quality education. This should also encourage prospective students by demonstrating that we are striving for academic excellence.

Accreditation will bring other benefits for our students. Accreditation should make it easier for Bible School students to transfer credits to other institutions. Accreditation will give seminarians who want to go on to further education better access to graduate programs in other schools. Students who are veterans will now have full access to Veteran's benefits. Students who have incurred student loans from college will no longer be required to begin repaying these loans while they are attending our schools. Through accreditation, the repayment of student loans will be deferred until after graduation.

The entire accreditation process will take up to seven years. We must first complete a self-study in preparation for a visit from a TRACS evaluation team. If the evaluation team determines that we are in "substantial compliance" with TRACS standards, then we may apply to the TRACS Accreditation Commission for candidate status. When candidate status is granted, we will have five years to achieve "full compliance" with TRACS standards and be granted full accreditation.

As has been previously reported, one of the difficulties in achieving accreditation is TRACS' requirement that each instructor, at least on the seminary level, possess a terminal degree or Ph.D. However, there appears to be some leeway for experienced teachers. By the time of the conference, we will have met with a TRACS representative and we hope to have this question answered. We may also need to restructure the administration of our schools by the addition of a President.

FACILITIES:

Both the Annual Conference and the Schools Corporation encouraged us to continue with the next phase of Vision by pursuing a multipurpose auditorium/gymnasium and a new dormitory. In the past year we have established three committees to carry out this project. The first is the Prayer Committee chaired by Pastor Kirk Flaa. If you would like to become part of the Prayer Team, please talk to Pastor Flaa or visit the Bible School display for more information. The second committee is the Building Committee, chaired by Dr. Dan Mundfrom. The third is the Finance Committee, chaired by Steve Jankord. I am grateful for the commitment and work of everyone involved. Steve Jankord will give a complete report on the building program later in the conference.

FINANCES:

The enrollment at the Bible School was lower than anticipated for the 2010-2011 fiscal year, and as a result the school year ended with a small deficit. The seminary also ended the fiscal year with a deficit. However, the seminary deficit was smaller than in past years because of greater enrollment. After careful budgeting we hope to end the 2011-2012 fiscal year in the black for both schools.

The Board of Trustees is grateful for legacies received from friends of the schools. This past year the schools received a gift from the estate of Martin and Pearl Bjornson of Valley City. Part of this legacy was used for needed expenditures for the Bible School including lounge furniture for the men's dorm and Heritage Hall, a security camera system, and new copiers. The Board of Trustees also set aside a large portion for fees and other costs incurred in pursuing accreditation.

The proposed AFLTS budget for the 2012-2013 is \$505,575. This includes an increase in tuition from \$320 to \$330 per credit hour. The proposed AFLBS budget for the same period is \$1,695,924. This includes an increase in the board plan from \$925 to \$975 per semester and an increase in room rates from \$1075 to \$1100 per semester because of increased food and utility costs. We regret these increases; however, they are necessary to present a balanced budget. Based on these budgets, the Board of Trustees requests the Annual Conference to approve a projected subsidy from congregations and individuals of \$280,000 for AFLTS and \$485,000 for AFLBS.

BOARD ORGANIZATION:

The members of the Board of Trustees are Rev. Dana Coyle, Rev. Martin Horn, Mr. Steve Jankord, Rev. Lloyd Quanbeck, Mr. Mike McCarlson, Mr. John Talley, and Mr. Loiell Dyrud. The officers are Martin Horn, Chairman; Steve Jankord, Vice-Chairman; and Dana Coyle, Secretary. Steve Jankord has served a five-year term and is eligible for re-election.

As we meet together in this historic annual conference marking fifty years of God's great faithfulness in honoring His Word among us, we can do no less than bow in humble worship and thanksgiving. In His mercy and according to His promise. He has provided sufficient resources and the necessary strength for every "open door" He has placed before our congregations (Philippians 4:19). OUR FORTY-EIGHTH YEAR

On May 19, 2012, the seminary concluded its forty-eighth year in graduation exercises conducted jointly with the Bible school. Eight men completed study programs at AFLTS during the past year. They include the following: Roger

Eugene David, Terrance Shane Kruger, George Charles Lautner, Barry Lee Nelson, Jerry Allen Nelson, Douglas Titus Mmari, Adam Gregory Osier, and Scott Kenneth Stroud. Twenty-nine men were enrolled this past year including five part-time students. Seventy people from fourteen states were registered for classes during the annual Summer Institute of Theology held on the campus in August, 2011.

Two men have been given twelve-month internship assignments during the current year. The interns and the congregations to which they have been assigned are as follows: Luke Emerson, St. John's Lutheran Church, Newark, Ohio (Tom Olson, pastoral supervisor), and Sam Menge, Our Savior's Free Lutheran Church, Stanley, North Dakota (Rodney Johnson, pastoral supervisor). Upon receiving recommendations from the seminary faculty, the Board of Trustees, the Coordinating Committee, and the Colloguy Committee. Luke and Sam will be open for Call as of March 1, 2013. The seminary gives thanks to God for the congregations and pastors who partner with the seminary in the internship program. The internship year provides a special opportunity for students to apply many of the skills learned in the seminary classroom during their three years on the campus. The seminary invites interested congregations to prayerfully consider submitting a request for an intern for the next internship cycle (June 1, 2013 – May 31, 2014). Contact the seminary office for more information about the program. Requests should be received by February 1, 2013.

The seminary Inter-Term program was conducted in January, 2012. Under the theme, "To All the Nations," three courses were offered, Introduction to Missions, taught by Missionary Todd Schierkolk, Church Planting and Development, taught by Pastor Paul Nash, and The Church and the Law, taught by Attorney John Talley. The next Inter-Term is scheduled for January 7-18, 2013 with two courses to be offered, Hymns and Music of the Church, and Ministry to Youth. Interested friends are welcome to register for one or both of the courses. Please contact the seminary office for more information regarding next year's program.

The following full-time faculty members taught at the seminary during the past year: Rev. Philip Haugen, Rev. Robert Lee, Rev. Jerry Moan, Rev. Brent Olson and Dr. Francis Monseth. Part-time instructors included Dr. Oliver Blosser, Mr. Andrew Hanson, Rev. James Rasmussen, Rev. Joel Rolf, and Dr. Tim Skramstad. In addition to his regular teaching schedule on the campus, Pastor Haugen continues New Testament studies on a part-time basis in a Doctor of Ministry (D. Min.) program through Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Missouri. Pastor Olson's teaching load in the seminary and Bible school is reduced as he works on a major dissertation in Old Testament studies, the final requirement for a Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) degree at Concordia. Mr. Hanson is completing his work on a Master's degree in choral conducting at

St. Cloud State University in addition to his work as director of music at AFLC Schools. We are thankful to God for each of our faculty members. Their evident commitment to Christ and His Word and their prayerful desire to faithfully teach the truths of Scripture to their students with clarity, conviction and compassion is cause for praise and thanksgiving to God.

We are thankful for each of our gifted staff members who are a vital part of the maintenance and development of the seminary program. Mrs. Mitchell (Marilee) Johnson serves as the seminary's administrative assistant and as such, efficiently and graciously helps to facilitate and oversee many of the programs and activities connected with seminary life. Mr. Larry Walker is the able administrator of the campus library and in this capacity, serves our seminary students and faculty in providing suitable resources for study and research. The seminary works closely with the campus business office and is thankful for the excellent work of Mr. Larry Myhrer in financial reporting and in expediting the business affairs of the seminary. Other personnel who provide valuable assistance in the ministries of the seminary include Ruth Gunderson, editor of the seminary publication, The Servant Pastor, Mr. Wayne Floan, head of the campus maintenance team and his assistant, Mr. Arv Bergstedt. Together, our staff and faculty are one in their prayerful goal of fulfilling the God-given mission of AFLC Schools.

The seminary student and faculty wives met bi-weekly for Bible study, prayer and fellowship during the past school year. The theme Bible passage selected was I John 4:7-9: "Beloved, let us love another, for love is from God; and everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. The one who does not love does not know God, for God is love. By this the love of God was manifested in us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world so that we might live through Him." In their study of I Corinthians the first Monday each month, the women used the WMF Bible study guide, "Gift of Grace," by Nancy Holcomb. Serving as leaders of the women's fellowship this past year were Adela Jore, president; Wanda Hein, vice-president; Carmen Lusk, secretary; and prayer-chain coordinator, Kelly Emerson. The treasurer's duties were divided among the members of the executive committee. The advisor for the group is Ellen Monseth.

SUMMER INSTITUTE OF THEOLOGY

The thirty-fifth annual Summer Institute of Theology will be conducted on our Medicine Lake campus August 6-10 under the theme, "Remembering Our Creator" Five ten-hour courses will be offered including Studies in Genesis, Pastor Peter Franz, instructor; Studies in Thessalonians, Pastor Jerry Moan, instructor; Introduction to Christian Ethics, Dr. Fran Monseth, instructor; Ministry to Youth, Pastor Jason Holt, instructor; and History and Aims of the AFLC, Pastor Bob Lee, instructor.

As a ministry of the seminary, the summer institute provides an opportunity for continuing study for those who are in full-time Christian ministry and for those who desire further training as lay-leaders and workers in their congregations. The institute also serves the AFLC in the annual licensing of "lay-pastors" by the Coordinating Committee. A full range of courses in the Old and New Testaments, systematic theology, church history, and practical theology are offered in a twelve-year cycle. When a person has successfully completed 96 credits, he receives the Certificate of Pastoral Studies (C.P.S.) diploma. Acceptance into the program leading to the diploma is based on previous experience in pastoral ministry. Credits earned in the institute are not transferable into the regular seminary program due to the modified expectations for course fulfillment as well as the compacted format of the courses. For those who register for credit at the institute, assignments are given that are due in the seminary office by December 1 of the same year. The costs of the institute remain modest. The seminary welcomes all interested friends to contact the seminary office or the seminary website for more information about the program in August.

THE COMING ACADEMIC YEAR

The next seminary academic year will begin, Lord willing, on Tuesday, September 4, 2012 with registration and orientation. We are thankful for the new students who have made application to attend. It is always an inspiration for the Board of Trustees and faculty to interview the applicants and to hear their testimonies of how the Lord has led them to seek admittance. Others who may be planning to apply are encouraged to contact the seminary very soon to ensure completion of the application process in time for entrance in September. We invite continuing prayer for God's guidance of those who are considering preparation for the Christian ministry. It is a great joy to witness how prayers have been answered as both younger and older men step forward in obedience to the Lord's direction. Continuing prayer for all of our returning students and their families is also solicited. In addition to the challenging life of a seminary student, many of the men face the responsibility and privilege of fulfilling their God-given roles in the home as spiritual leaders and providers. Pray too for the wives of our students as they seek to be faithful "help-mates" with their husbands during the years of seminary training.

A continuing opportunity offered by the seminary is our "Adopt-a-Student" program. This program provides a means through which interested friends (individuals or congregations) can connect personally with seminary students and their families during their campus studies. Those who want to sponsor (or "adopt") a student contact the seminary expressing their desire to take an active part in encouraging and helping a student. Each sponsor is assigned a student by the seminary and begins an informal and unstructured relationship of mutual correspondence. "Adopted" students write to their sponsors, telling of the blessings and challenges of seminary life along with answers to prayer

and requests for prayer. The sponsor-student relationship can be of significant encouragement and help to students. Through this program, it is observed that a closer relationship with the seminary and its mission of training "servant-pastors" is fostered in those who takes part. More information can be obtained on the seminary website or by contacting the seminary office.

GRATEFULNESS TO GOD AND HIS PEOPLE

The seminary campus family of students, staff and faculty is deeply grateful for the prayers and support of the congregations of our AFLC. Conscious of the effectiveness of prayer in furthering God's "kingdom work," we urge the continuation of those prayers in the worship services, in the prayer meetings, and in the private "prayer closets" of our beloved constituency. It has often been said, "As the seminary goes, so goes the church!" If there is truth in that observation, then prayer and watchfulness is incumbent upon any church fellowship. REPORT OF THE DEAN OF THE BIBLE SCHOOL

To the fiftieth Annual Conference of the Association Free Lutheran Congregations assembled in Thief River Falls, MN June 12-15, 2012.

As we are gathered this year with the theme of "Jubilee," God's Word gives us great encouragement in Psalm 145, "Great is the Lord, and highly to be praised; and His greatness is unsearchable. One generation shall praise Thy works to another and shall declare Thy mighty acts. On the glorious splendor of Thy majesty and on Thy wonderful works I will meditate. And men shall speak of the power of Thy awesome acts; and I will tell of Thy greatness. They shall eagerly utter the memory of Thine abundant goodness and shout joyfully of Thy righteousness" Psalm 145:3-7.

The greatness and glory of God is beyond our comprehension. He gives us a glimpse of His glory and greatness as we consider and see His work of Creation, Redemption, Salvation, Sanctification, Preservation, Resurrection, and Glorification. Ponder God's mercies and grace to you and His wonderful works and miracles in your lifetime! Think about the many answers to prayer you have experienced in your life, both in prayers that you prayed, as well as those that others prayed for you. It is no wonder the Psalmist declares, "On the glorious splendor of Thy Majesty and on Thy wonderful works I will meditate . . . and speak of the power of Thine awesome acts and tell of Thy greatness!"

This 50th anniversary of the AFLC is also a wonderful time for "One generation to praise God's works to another and declare God's mighty acts." We can be so grateful to God for the vision God gave in the early days of the AFLC to begin the Seminary and the Bible School for the training of pastors, missionaries and servant in God's kingdom. We can thank the Lord for His many provisions for our schools, including the beautiful spacious campus and all the buildings, chapel, dormitories, and student center. We are especially grateful for the faculty, staff, and the students who have come through the years. Since the Bible School began in 1966, many have been taught and trained in the inspired and inerrant Word of God for a life of faith in Jesus Christ and faithful service in His kingdom. This continues to be our mission! It is humbling to see how God has used these schools to train kingdom workers from more than 20 countries! There are graduates of our schools serving the Lord literally around the world! To God be the glory for the work He is doing in each heart and life!

BIBLE SCHOOL MINISTRY

It has been encouraging to see evidences of this working of God through His Word on campus again this year, and we pray it would continue in each heart

and life! We encourage students to have a daily devotional time of Bible study and prayer before class devotions at 7:45 a.m. each morning. Students also meet with other students for devotions most nights of the week. Our campus staff meets for daily devotions at 8:00 a.m. each morning. These times continue to be a great encouragement to be strengthened by God's Word and to pray for our campus and AFLC family.

This past year Bible School enrollment included 61 junior students, 46 senior students and 5 Ministry Training Institute students for all or part of the year, for a total of 112 students. Students have come from 12 states and 6 foreign countries. While the total attendance was down this year, it was encouraging to see that 10 of our junior students were either the first students to attend Bible school from their AFLC congregation or the first in at least 5 years to come from their AFLC congregations. Of the 112 students this year, 91 are from 66 of our AFLC congregations. The previous year students came from 56 AFLC congregations.

The Bible School exists to serve the congregations of the AFLC and beyond, and seeks to serve as an extension of the ministry of each of our congregations. Our prayerful goal is that there would be at least one student from each of the more than 280 AFLC congregations coming each year to be further trained in God's Word! We were really encouraged on campus this week when a pastor wrote and said, ". . . on any given Sunday in our congregation, one can observe former AFLBS students teaching Sunday School, attending worship, serving as council members, serving in music ministry, and in general being strong members of our congregation. Every year choirs, gospel teams, and youth workers from AFLBS make a strong impact, not only on the youth of our congregation, but also on the youth of our community. Our congregation invests heavily in the ministry of our Bible School, not only because we embrace the AFLC's vision of having a Bible School, but also because we have actually experienced the school's positive impact on our own congregation."

It has been a tremendous blessing this past year to see the growing scholarship support in many AFLC congregations. This scholarship support ranges anywhere from a few hundred dollars to the full tuition amount of \$4,500. Sixty-nine students received scholarship support from their congregation, averaging nearly \$1,500 per person. When congregations establish a scholarship fund to support their youth in coming to study at Bible School, it sends an encouraging message to youth that the congregation would love to see them grow stronger in their faith in Jesus Christ and that they believe it is a wonderful investment for the rest of their life! We would encourage each congregation to support their youth in this way!

We believe congregational scholarship support is highly valuable because it

gives ownership to the congregation. It becomes something that can be talked about and promoted while children are growing up. Congregations that have caught the vision for this have been blessed to see its impact in hearts, lives, family, congregation, and beyond!

While we believe congregational support invaluable, we also recognize that not all congregations will be able to provide large scholarship support and some students desiring to come will not have any financial help. To help meet this need, we have initiated the Scholarship 400 this spring. The Scholarship 400 initiative is seeking 400 people who would be willing to give \$250.00 per year for student scholarships over and above other giving to their congregation and its ministries. This would raise \$100,000 per year to help more students to be able to come study God's Word at Bible School. It has been encouraging to see the response this March as more than 80 have responded with their support.

We appreciate all the ways you pray for and encourage students to consider the eternal value when they devote a year or two to studying God's Word! Thank you for the opportunities you give Bible School students to come to your congregations and share what they are learning! This school year, eight gospel teams ministered primarily on weekends in various congregations, youth retreats, nursing homes, and other evangelism and urban ministries. Most students are also involved with ministry in area AFLC congregations with children, youth, or music ministry each week. This summer there are eight summer teams sent out for music ministry, vacation Bible schools, and Bible camp ministry. The Proclaim Choir shared eight concerts in Midwest congregations this spring. The Concert Choir presented 16 concerts in congregations, as well as three mini-concerts in schools and nursing homes over 18 days in Minnesota, North Dakota, Montana, Washington and Oregon. The Mission field study class, during this same time, ministered in Ecuador.

We thank the Lord for each open door He gives! We rejoice as people come to saving faith in Jesus Christ and others are strengthened in their faith in the Lord!

This year we had five students in the Ministry Training Institute (MTI) of AFLBS. This is the first time all of the students were in the Youth Ministry track. During the spring semester they have a three month internship and further mentoring by the pastor and youth ministry staff in the congregation. AFLC SCHOOLS VISION FOR EXPANDING OUR REACH

To the fiftieth Annual Conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations assembled in Thief River Falls, MN June 12-15, 2012.

Building on the master plan that the Board of Trustees developed in 1997, the Schools Corporation has approved moving forward with the next phase of Vision. A current building committee, chaired by Dan Mundfrom, has updated plans and cost estimates for a multipurpose auditorium/gymnasium and a dormitory to hold another 100 students. A prayer committee, chaired by Pastor Kirk Flaa, is now actively praying for the AFLC's needs and future. A finance committee, chaired by Steve Jankord, is actively working toward communicating this opportunity in a strategically effective manner. The Board of Trustees has approved the establishment of a \$5 Million Permanent Endowment Scholarship Fund for AFLBS students. The goal is to make Bible School available and affordable for all who desire to attend, regardless of their financial situation.

Not just bigger, but by God's grace we desire to develop better schools. The Schools Corporation has approved the Board of Trustees to pursue accreditation for our Seminary which then our Bible School program would also be accredited. Going through accreditation will sharpen us and help us to improve on what we have. It will make it easier for our Bible School Students to transfer credits to accredited colleges after Bible School. We believe strongly that throughout this process we can and will maintain the integrity of our schools heritage and would not pursue accreditation if we would have to change our core principles.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR EXPANDING OUR REACH

With the completion of the next phase of Vision, we will truly be able to accommodate 250 Bible School students on campus every year. With success in this phase of Vision – Bible School will be available and affordable to any who desire to come.

Completing this next phase of Vision will provide these benefits:

- •Affordable Bible School will be affordable to any who desire to attend.
- •Academically strong and distinctive The AFLBS and MTI program focused on the Bible and its application to their lives will enhance the power of the Word and the Spirit in more and more lives each year.
- •Tradition of Music Excellence The expanded facilities will provide more opportunity for music development in all of our students and more of our students. We will be able to provide more outreach and concerts to the local community. We will now have opportunities to have summer music camps in the future.

- •Recreation, exercise, intramural and intercollegiate athletics will be enhanced with these new facilities. Minnesota winters are long and having indoor space for recreation, exercise and sports of many kinds will enhance the overall education experience on the campus. We will also have opportunity to provide summer sports camps in the future.
- •Music and Service Ministry Teams will be expanded and improved because of the space available to handle more students and more training. This provides a great service to our congregations today and also for the future as our students return to congregational life equipped for service.

Completing this next phase of Vision will allow us to approximately double the number of AFLBS students that will graduate each year. This will provide the AFLC congregations many more young people trained to serve in Free Lutheran Congregational Life. More equipped Bible School students provide more and more servants interested and available for Home Missions and World Missions Work. Training more Bible School Students more effectively provides the opportunity for more young men considering a life of a servant pastor and attending our seminary in the future.

PERSEVERING TO THE END

The challenges to success are always before us. Our students are faced with more and more financial challenges to attend Bible School. But with the reality that approximately 50% of freshman going to a traditional college – will abandon their faith by the time they graduate – that should give us pause as we consider where our youth should go after high school. The challenge to our faith is real and yet the rewards of Bible School training are life changing.

So in view of the shortness of time and the length of eternity, we recognize the urgency of our cause. Our legacy for our next generation will depend greatly on what we do at this time of our Association.

REPORT OF THE WORLD MISSIONS COMMITTEE CHAIRMAN AND THE WORLD MISSIONS DIRECTOR

To the Fiftieth Annual Conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations, assembled in Thief River Falls, Minnesota, June 12-15, 2012.

Fifty years ago the AFLC started here in Thief River Falls, therefore this year we look back and notice the blessings God has brought our way. The theme verse it is fitting as it reminds us, "This is the LORD'S doing; It is marvelous in our eyes. This is the day which the LORD has made; Let us rejoice and be glad in it."

The theme of Jubilee is also appropriate as it marks our fifty years of existence. The term Jubilee in the Scriptures not only defines a fifty year celebration, but it goes much deeper than that. Ponder the term Jubilee briefly as we take a glimpse at its meaning past, present and future.

Jubilee Past

In the Old Testament the Jubilee was a fifty year celebration where the children of God were set free from a number of physical bondages. Their debts were canceled, slaves were set free and they were given rest. They were instructed to proclaim liberty throughout the land to all of its inhabitants.

Jubilee Present

Jesus life and sacrifice set us free from of spiritual bondage. Our debits to God have been canceled, as slaves to sin we have been set free and we have been given rest from working out our own salvation. Jesus started his ministry by declaring, "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." (Luke 4:18-19) We were instructed to proclaim this liberty throughout the world to all of its inhabitants.

Jubilee Future

One of the most interesting facts of the Jubilee is the meaning of the term itself. The Hebrew word Jubilee means the blowing of the trumpet. The ultimate implementation of the Jubilee is when the final trumpet is blown. The Scriptures speak of that final trumpet blast in 1 Corinthians 15:51-58,

Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed— in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality. When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God!

He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.

In anticipation of His coming, give yourself fully to the work of the Lord, proclaim this liberty throughout the world to all of its inhabitants.

Fields of Work

Brazil

UNITY

One of our major concerns in the recent past was unity. There were several factions attempting to seek power in the vacuum created when missionary Connely Dyrud no longer lived in Brazil. Our current missionaries, Jonathan and Tamba Abel, Paul and Becky Abel and Jonni Sliver have worked hard to bring unity among the church body. The missionaries, along with Brazilian president Joel Mendes, have traveled to all of the congregations to encourage them and promote unity of the church body. Their work and effort has been used by God to bring about unity and greater attendance at church wide functions such as conferences, Bible camps, retreats and the Bible school. Recently I attended a retreat in Brazil where there were several hundred people present.

BIBLE SCHOOL

Our Bible school is experiencing an increase in attendance. There are a number of reasons for this. Jonathan Abel, along with the national leadership reorganized the curriculum a couple of years ago making it applicable to both seminary and Bible school students. Jonni Sliver has promoted the school among the churches. Rev. Kevin Olson has used his gift of encouragement to help the national leadership see that they can have a school by depending upon God to lead and supply their needs. The enthusiasm of the students and leadership was a delight to see as I traveled to Brazil this year.

MIRIAM INFANT HOME

The Miriam Infant Home has always been seen by the Brazilian church as our ministry and not theirs. Jonni Sliver has promoted the Infant Home among the churches in Brazil as well as in the United States. The result is that several of the congregations in Brazil are starting to support the home. One lady has started selling baked goods after church and sending the money to the Infant home.

VISION

Our future vision for Brazil is to come along side of them helping and encouraging them in the ministry. In the past they have seen the ministries as ours and they have come alongside of us. This will be a great shift which will allow us to put more resources into new ministries which will broaden the work.

India

UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS

Making an effort to reach unreached people groups is extremely important in India. A village may have a local church, but because of the cast system, there may be people groups in that village that remain unreached. Those who are believers within the church would be happy to have other casts attend. Unfortunately, unbelievers of other casts view things differently. Lower casts hesitate to attend higher cast churches because people of higher casts have been oppressing them all week, and they are looking to avoid that. Unbelievers of higher casts hesitate to attend a lower cast church, as they don't associate with those on a lower plane. We consider this strange in our culture, especially for Christians, but it is a reality in India. Therefore, the need to reach unreached people groups is even greater. We are making a specific effort to reach unreached people groups in India.

NEW BUILDING

The AFLC-India began discussing the need for a new building to house St. Paul's School with the World Missions Committee in 2007. St. Paul's School is a K-10th grade school on the AFLC-I headquarters site. St. Paul's normally has 300-400 children in attendance. The building has a thatch roof and is open on the sides. During the monsoon season the rain comes in and ruins the children's books and paper. The World Mission Committee had a number of concerns about approving the building. One by one those concerns were answered. Over the years the proposed building grew in size and incorporated additional aspects including: offices, a chapel, room for a Bible school, a medical clinic, the Horeb Children's Home, guest rooms and St. Paul's School.

Last summer the World Missions Committee approved putting the building on the Special Projects List. This means that money could now be raised for the building. The final price was \$320,000.00. The World Missions Committee agreed to match all funds received in the first two years with an \$110,000.00 legacy. Last November, before the building was promoted on the Special Project List, the Lord provided in a miraculous way through the Dorothy and Sheldon Een estate. Although the requested amount for the building has been met, the World Mission Committee decided to leave the building on the Special Project List. This will allow people of the AFLC to have the opportunity to partake in the blessing of providing the Gospel for children and adults in India through the tool of this building. Recently we have discovered that the building will cost more than was originally estimated as there will be a cost to tear down the old structures on the site. This building will bless the AFLC-I for many years to come as people are brought to Christ and discipled within its walls.

Mexico

CONTINUED VIOLENCE

The violence in Mexico continues, 47 thousand people were killed in drug related homicides in the last five years. Considering this the World Missions Committee has asked the Schierkolks to remain on furlough until at least

September of this year. Please pray that the Lord would ease the danger in Mexico speeding the spread of the Gospel.

The World Mission Committee realized that Todd Schierkolk needed to renew his visa and allowed Todd and I to travel to Mexico for a few days. We visited most of the ministries in Mexico during that time.

LEON

We reduced the funding going to the church in Leon with the goal of promoting self sufficiency. The church felt that we abandoned them, but God has done some amazing things since that time. Several new families have moved to Leon and have started attending the congregation. Pastor Samuel Flores, who is now 91, is now being assisted by his son Heber. The congregation has started reaching out to the neighborhood and is now growing. For several decades the church has been meeting in a chapel while the church building stood unfinished. With the new growth they realized that they needed to finish the church. Since my last visit, the roof was completed, they have the funds for the windows and an electrician from the congregation has offered to do the electrical work without charge.

CELAYA

The work in Celaya is also going forward. They are reaching out to the neighboring city of Querétaro where they have services a couple of times a month. The laymen in Celaya are being trained to lead the congregation. Rev. Milton Flores stated that in a couple of years his family will be ready to move to Querétaro to serve them full time.

JFRF7

During Schierkolks absence, laymen have been leading the work in Jerez. Rev. Ricardo Varela travels to Jerez monthly to provide communion and other pastoral service. Todd Schierkolk was encouraged as he visited the congregation in Jerez.

In spite of the violence, God is at work in these congregations and they are becoming self (God) sufficient.

Uganda

Missionaries Nate and Rhoda Jore began work in Uganda in 2006. Nate sensed that it was God's will for him to focus on training pastors and leaders. The goal is for these leaders to train other leaders (2 Tim. 2:2). The training that has gone on this year, will be described in the next section under the heading of Ambassador Institute. Two Short Term Assistants have helped the Jores in this work, Micah Berger and Hans Tanner. Hans Tanner will be returning to continue his schooling and getting married, Andrew Olson will take his place.

The Jores are expecting the birth of their fifth child. Lord willing, it will have arrived by the time of this conference. The Jores are planning to be home on furlough and are expecting to be here at the conference.

Ambassador Institute

The purpose of Ambassador Institute is to distribute solid biblical and theological education around the world. Rev. Olson, head of Ambassador Institute, travels to our mission fields regularly. He has a great spiritual gift of encouragement and has been able to come along side of the nationals on every field and give them the confidence that they can teach pastors and church leaders with God's help. His gift of encouragement has been a blessing to other aspects of the work on the field as well.

One of the major components of Ambassador Institute its oral curriculum. It is a method of teaching the Scriptures through word of mouth. The curriculum is especially useful for training students who primarily learn through the spoken word. The curriculum has been translated from English to Lusoga, Portuguese, Spanish and Telugu.

Ambassador Institute is presently working in Brazil, India and Uganda. Interest has been shown from Ecuador, Belarus, Ukraine, Democratic Republic of Congo, Myanmar, Southern Sudan and Russia.

AI - INDIA

The training in India has been organized with a combination of orality and supplemental courses. The purpose of the training is to strengthen the pastors and leaders in the AFLC-India, but a number of students from outside of the AFLC-I have heard about the training and had a desire to attend the classes. After two years of study the students are prepared for graduation. Twenty students graduated at our last graduation, which took place in January. The graduates of these classes will go on to be pastors and Bible women in churches in India.

Classes take place at three separate sites. These sites are a great distance from each other. It is more convenient for a teacher to travel to the site than for all the students to come to a central location. Recently a new site north of our normal area of ministry requested classes. That area has 20-25 students who desire to take the classes.

AI - UGANDA

Ambassador Institute graduated its first class last year. This year we are in the second cycle of classes. We rejoice that it is being taught by a number of graduates from the first class. Missionary Nate Jore is now acting as a teacher of teachers. There are now 10 classes. Kevin Olson traveled to Uganda in January to encourage the work and to hold a teacher training seminar. Each class came with a Bible lesson that they have been teaching. One of the goals of the teacher training seminar is to allow the teachers to learn from each other.

AI - BRAZII

Ambassador Institute has been a great encouragement for our ongoing Bible school and seminary training in Brazil. Rev. Olson traveled to Brazil in October. While he was in Brazil he visited a number of the congregations and

introduce the Portuguese translation of the oral curriculum.

AI - GOALS

In addition to pursuing new opportunities for teaching, this year the goal for Ambassador Institute is to make it the highest quality program possible. We will be focusing on Lutheran distinctives, the concept of free and living congregations and quality control within each country. The quality control will focus on teachers, attendance and grades.

It has been the goal that Ambassador Institute will be self supporting. The first year it was in existence, Ambassador Institute was expected to raise 20% of its support. That percentage was to go up 20% each year. Last year the support was to be 80%. At this time we are right on track and expecting Ambassador Institute to raise full support this year. We have to thank God and the people of the AFLC for supporting this great work.

Pillmans

Justo and Patricia Pillman started working with World Missions in August of last year. Since then they have been busy with the birth of their son Nathanael, completing required educational obligations and deputation. The World Mission Committee approved their departure to Ecuador following the Annual Conference.

Finances

We praise the Lord for His continuing provision for AFLC World Missions through the generous support of the people of the AFLC. The decrease in the 2012 Field/Expense request was due to reducing some of the monies sent to the fields in an effort to reduce dependency on outside funds and increase financial self-sufficiency. The increase in the 2013 Field/Expense request is due to our being unsure if the increase in receipts over the approved budget that were received in 2011 will now continue through 2012 and is also due to costs going up as we begin paying for the Director of Development. There is also the possibility of the Ambassador Institute not receiving 100% of their budget, as planned, for this year. The increase in the 2013 Personal Support request is due to adding a new missionary on the field (Jonni Sliver) in 2011 and plans to send a missionary family (the Justo Pillmans) yet in 2012 and possibly having another missionary family being commissioned for this budget;

Our financial requests do not reflect any giving to special projects. Each year the World Missions Committee receives requests to fund various special projects. We prayerfully consider these projects and decide which ones to approve. Some projects are rejected because they do not fit into the plan and scope of our work, some will create continued dependency upon outside funding, and some will create a program that the national church could never sustain. It is easy for the field to request a special project. In many cases it is just as easy to receive funding for that project because people identify with concrete tangible requests. Yet it is not always in the best interest to fund a project. The criteria for approving a special project are: 1) it has a set dollar amount; 2) it has a set starting and ending date; and 3) it is for a specific defined item. The WMC posts a list of the approved projects on the World Missions website. We would encourage all donors to be informed of the approved special projects and give as you feel led.

We give thanks to the Lord for calling our missionaries, both full time and short term, to serve Him throughout the world, and for providing for them, and to them for their faithful service to Him. They do an incredible job as ambassadors for Christ Jesus, representing and introducing Him to those they meet in other cultures. REPORT OF THE HOME MISSION DIRECTOR

To The 50th annual conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations assembled in Thief River Falls, Minnesota, June 12-15, 2012.

"This is the Lord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes. This is the day which the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it,"

Psalm 118: 23–24.

Since our early and humble beginning in 1962 the world which the AFLC sought to reach for Jesus Christ has had many changes. There is hardly an aspect of life that hasn't been touched by technology. From our Association infancy, when communication took place on party lines, to 2012, where 1 out of 2 Americans walk around with a savvy smartphone, capable of accessing the internet, e-mail, and GPS. Although technology advances ever forward, the heart of man changes not. The heart still needs Holy Spirit control. It still needs regular feeding in the Word of God. It still needs Jesus.

This year we celebrate 50 years of God's blessings and provision, and look into the future, asking God for another 50 years to serve Him. May our focus be completely upon Him, as we seek to hallow His Name in our midst.

At the time of writing this report, I am on a eight day trip across the Midwest, meeting with representatives of ten AFLC congregations. How grateful we are for Lavon and Fern's faithful service over these past 12 years to the AFLC family. Only eternity will truly reveal those who have been touched by his quiet and steadfast way of ministering to us all. Thank you, Lavon, for your example and for the privilege of working alongside of you.

Christie Ballmann, became **Christie Friestad** in August 2011, when she wed Chad, our Director of Development at the AFLC Bible School. We are grateful for both of them and their ministry teamwork within the AFLC family. They are

expecting their first child in August, which means there will be additional changes coming to the Home Missions office. Christie is stepping down from her position as my Administrative Assistant to take care of a new baby. We're diligently seeking the Lord, asking Him to lead us in the selection of our Home Missions staff in the days ahead. Thank you, Christie and Chad, for your willingness to navigate with us through these changes. We anticipate continued service together in the years ahead.

Pastor Rick Long, Chairman of the Home Missions Committee is addressing the status of the Home Missions Committee in his report, and I will deflect that attention to him. I will use this space to say that we are very grateful for each of our Home Mission Committee members, their wives and how they faithfully serve our AFLC Home Missions department. Our current board is: Rev. Richard Long (Chairman), Mr. Willis Kettelhut (Vice-Chairman), Mr. Kenn Graham (Secretary), Rev. Dale Finstrom, Mr. Carl Busse, Rev. Joe Ocker, and Mr. Tom Caouette. There are endless meetings, phone conferences, and responsibilities that these men tend to. What is most amazing is the spirit of love and mercy that they bring with them in dealing with the leadership issues in hand. Thank you, men, for your service; may God continue to lead and bless you.

One of the pressing needs of AFLC Home Missions is bringing the ministry of our current Home Missions congregations, to supporting AFLC congregations, in a living and participatory way that highlights what God is doing. We want people to stand in awe with us! It is not feasible for the Director to take all the time that's needed to visit our 270+ congregations to present this work. So, we have developed an initiative called **Come Join Us**, using experienced laity to travel and share the work of AFLC Home Missions.

August 2011, **Loren Tungseth** accepted a call from the Home Missions Committee as Director of Resource Development. His three fold responsibilities are 1) oversight of the Come Join Us initiative, 2) serving as liaison for the work in Alaska, and 3) oversight of general Home Missions finances. Upon accepting this call, Loren resigned from the Home Missions Committee; the remainder of his term is being fulfilled by Tom Caouette. Thank you, Tom, for stepping up to this position.

With 60+ presentations to date in Sunday School classes, or morning and evening services, Come Join Us has met with positive feedback. A common phrase we hear after our multi-media presentation is, "Now I understand what Home Missions is about." It is exciting that Loren's wife, Sharon, is able to join him for most trips; they make an awesome ministry team. Loren is presently paid a modest, part-time salary and has use of a Home Missions van as he travels. We welcome Loren and Sharon on-board as staff members.

Please consider inviting the Tungseths to tell the Come Join Us story to your congregation.

Laurie, my faithful bride, has traveled with me as time has allowed. She is a gracious and able minister to a very important section of our church body...the women. She has been spending time writing and developing materials for the Disciplines of a Godly Woman class, which she's been teaching at the Bible School. Some of this material she has been presenting to congregations. Laurie also fills in at the office when Christie travels. I am so grateful for her willingness to serve.

The Naknek, Alaska Mission

Pastor Jeremy and Lacey Crowell, along with their son Malachi, are serving the AFLC Mission work in Naknek, Alaska as our first full-time pilot/mechanic. Jeremy is also helping with the radio station and serving in numerous capacities that give him opportunities share the Word, preach, and minister to the people in Naknek. Through aviation, he is also helping us expand the outreach of our mission to neighboring villages. Jeremy, Lacey, and Malachi will be joining us at the 2012 Annual Conference. We look forward to having them bring fresh feedback from the ministry in Naknek.

Pastor Bob and Margaret Lee are going on two years of service at KAKN Christian Radio. Bob is a faithful servant and brings many years of experience from previous mission service, which is a settling influence with the harsh weather conditions that he faces in Naknek. Bob works hard to keep the station programming fresh and high quality. Recent programming changes have brought positive listener feedback. Family Life, Sports Spectrum Weekend, The Bluegrass Gospel Hour, and Revive Our Hearts are some of the new programs listeners enjoy. We are hoping to add more translators, extending the reach of our station programming. We are grateful for Parish Builder Ben Dahl traveling up for a second summer to assist Bob with special technical/engineering needs at the radio station this year. Bob's wife, Margaret, works in the Naknek public school, where she lives out what it means to be salt and light for Jesus. Her position also opens up relationships with families that we are trying to reach in Naknek.

Pastor Jeff and Jane Swanson and their youngest daughters, Hope and Abigail, are continuing to serve on loan to Lutheran Mission Society. One of the ministries Jeff heads up is a Friday night addiction recovery study for folks in the community. Jeff's servant attitude has been well received by Alaska locals. He is well known for his love and kindness. They are approaching five years of faithful service and we thank the Lord for this.

We will be having work teams from Dalton and Blue Earth, MN traveling to Naknek in July to build a needed garage/shop to house our vehicles. This past

winter Naknek experienced record freezing temperatures with harsh conditions. This causes the strain of the mission work to be elevated when the missionaries have no place with adequate heat to work on their vehicles, as well as keep the vehicles sheltered from the elements on a daily basis. This new metal building is designed with modest bunk room quarters, allowing us the flexibility of sending future work teams or maintenance volunteers up, without interfering in the day-to-day living arrangements of our missionaries.

Home Missions regularly receives contacts from interested volunteers for Naknek. We pray this garage will provide a workable solution for your participation down the road, to visit the ministry, encourage the missionaries, and use your skills for the Kingdom. We are also grateful for the many individuals, families, Sunday School classes and WMF groups that send up care packages to the missionaries. Packages are always opened with excitement. We encourage you to keep updated on the ministry in Alaska through our quarterly Naknek, Alaska Mission newsletter, available both in print and electronically.

We are thankful for the three members serving on the **Bay Broadcasting Company** (BBC) board: Eldwyn VanBruggen (President), Wayne Olson (Secretary) and Pastor Brian Davidson. At this year's 2012 Annual Conference Wayne Olson's position is up for election by the Mission Corporation. This year completes his 3 year term on the initial steering committee (as explained in past conference reports). He is eligible to run as a BBC member this year, as he sits on the Missions Corporation.

After the 2012 Annual Conference, all of the BBC positions will have been properly nominated by our Annual Conference and elected by the Corporation, on staggering, 3 year terms, with 1 election coming up each year. The BBC will have moved from steering committee status to permanent board positions.

Open Doors in Church Planting

Hope Lutheran, Enderlin, ND: Pastor Lee Hoops has helped oversee this congregation since its inception last summer. We've also been blessed to have Parish Builder/Seminarian Sam and Rachel Menge serving at Hope. Sam was a unique fit for nurturing this young congregation, since Enderlin was his hometown growing up, and he has numerous community connections. Sam served this congregation 3-5 days a week while his family lived Minneapolis. Not only did he gain valuable ministry experience, but he filled a great need. Thank you, Sam! The Menges are interning in Stanley, ND this coming year.

With the Enderlin congregation seeing growth, we are praying for God to provide a full time pastor. Doors are also expanding into neighboring cities, including Lisbon, ND. We hope to provide a Parish Builder for Enderlin until a

full-time pastor is able to join as a permanent part of that ministry.

New Hope Free Lutheran, Jamestown, ND: This past year Jamestown saw God's faithfulness in providing Pastor Frank Cherney as New Hope's first full time pastor. Pastor Frank is shepherding this two year old congregation through an exciting season of growth and lay discipleship. They worship in a Seventh-day Adventist facility. This congregation would love to see a Parish Builder join their ministry family.

Immanuel Lutheran, Springfield, MO: Pastor Richard and Kay Ramsbacher moved down to Springfield during the 2011 Annual Conference. What a blessing they've become to that ministry, seeing numerous people come to know the Lord Jesus Christ as their personal Savior. Changes are taking place both in the spiritual life and in the outward building of this congregation. Immanuel is located an hour north of Branson. We encourage our AFLC family to visit Immanuel if you are vacationing in the area. This past year Home Missions has also been working to clear up some title issues regarding the Immanuel property. We believe these will soon be resolved to God's glory.

Disciple Lutheran, Reading, PA/ Living Faith Lutheran Church, Boyertown, PA: Pastor Gene Enderlein served Disciple Lutheran with a 5/8 call for the past several years, traveling back and forth from MN to PA. Pastor Enderlein's Pennsylvania roots proved significant in leading and guiding the congregation during this time. In turn, Disciple has already helped another new congregation in Boyertown start up, Living Faith Lutheran Church. They are working together in forming a two point parish. Pastor Enderlein resigned April 2012, because of the distance and also because of a call he received to serve as visitation pastor at Hope Lutheran in North Minneapolis.

We are presently on our knees that God will supply a man of His choosing to work with these congregations in Pennsylvania. Similar to other Home Mission congregations, Disciple Lutheran is utilizing a Seventh-Day Adventist building. This presents opportunities and also challenges. The Boyertown congregation is using a school, which serves in the interim, but they will eventually need to find another spot.

Good Shepherd Free Lutheran, Brainerd, MN: Growth in attendance and membership led the congregation to purchase land off a well-traveled road in the Brainerd/Baxter area. They were able to pay for the property in full, broke ground in March, and are in the heart of a building program at the time of this Annual Conference. God willing, they will dedicate this new building by late summer or early fall. The congregation received a \$100,000 grant from the Builders Fellowship program. We are so thankful to those who have been a faithful part of Builders Fellowship these years, helping us grow a pool of funds to give as grant monies, rather than loans, to help new congregations experi-

encing growth. Praise to the Lord for His faithfulness! Due to growth and God's provision, the congregation also reduced their Home Mission subsidy for this year, and they believe that they'll be able to come off subsidy several years earlier than expected.

Good Shepherd Free Lutheran, Madison, SD: Under the leadership of Pastor Tony Stockman, Good Shepherd has also been seeing spiritual growth. Visiting with Pastor Tony last week I was excited to hear of several hearts recently given over to Jesus Christ. Tony's wife Rita, is attending Dakota State University in Madison, which brings many opportunities to share Christ. Some of the college students have come to Jesus. God might be opening a new door of opportunity for ministry among them. We note that with spiritual victory there also comes spiritual warfare, both for the congregation and the pastor. We ask that God would be honored and glorified, and that He would protect this congregation in the days ahead.

The Gathering, Hastings, MN: This group has been served the past two years by Parish Builders Luke and Kelly Emerson. Luke and his family leave on seminary internship in Ohio this summer. The work in Hastings has been an experiment in focusing on discipleship from the infancy of a congregation. We are praying for God to provide leadership for this congregation; we are seeking His face as to who and what should happen with this faithful group in the months ahead. They will be hosting a VBS later this summer.

Good Shepherd Free Lutheran, Camarillo, CA: This congregation is growing into the property and buildings that God provided for them in 2010. They now have two morning worship services and experience steady growth through Pastor Jim's daily radio program, Soul Break, children's outreach and almost 40 small groups. They continue to utilize unique venues for special services, such as a Good Friday service in a beautiful vineyard or a Easter sunrise service at Magu Beach. These attract curious visitors, which we are thankful for that. Just one example of the fruit from Good Shepherd ministry is a seminarian, Dave Lusk and his family, attending our AFLC seminary. Praise God for that!

Good Shepherd continues to be a dynamic training ground for our Parish Builders, many of whom go on to serve in other locations. We are grateful for a pastor and congregation that whole-heartedly embrace the Parish Builders, encouraging them, allowing them to live with them, and receiving many blessings from them in return.

Christ Community Church, Hagerstown, MD: Pastor Rich Carr, along with Pastor Mark Benz, serve the congregation also meeting in a Seventh-Day Adventist facility. They are seeing the fruit of discipleship, with a man from the congregation making the big move from MD to MN to start at AFLTS last fall.

George Winston and family just completed their first year of seminary, and we're grateful to have them with us and part of the AFLC family.

Calvary Free Lutheran, Mesa, AZ: Pastor Al and Connie Monson, with their Parish Builder team, stand in awe at God's open doors. The church's growing food pantry, Desert Manna, meets physical and spiritual needs, and requires additional staff. God has always provided just in time, and we trust Him with that.

One huge outreach of Calvary is their annual Harvest Festival. They had between 500-600 people visit their campus, where the Word of God was shared both in English and Spanish. Praise God for the many volunteers and the creativity that flows at that event. Many families are responding and considering Calvary a place of refuge and spiritual journey.

Returned missionaries, Pastor Dan and Debbie Giles, work in the congregation's Spanish speaking outreach. Their love for Spanish speakers and their ability to communicate with the language is a tremendous asset to reaching the Mesa community. Pastor Dan also serves another congregation east of Mesa.

Living Word Free Lutheran, Sioux Falls, SD: New families are being added to this Midwest congregation that places a strong emphasis on equipping and training up lay leadership. As I visited Living Word this past weekend, it was fun to see the new faces and hear how many of them have been reacquainted with the Word of the Lord and found living faith in Christ through this congregation. I enjoy seeing Pastor Wade creatively use a team concept to help spread God's Word. "Go team!"

Faith Lutheran, Bertrand, NE: Pastor Glen Frecks serves this small group. Although they are off subsidy, and small in number, they continue to meet. They are faithful to the Word of God and have opportunity bear witness in their community to the saving power of Jesus Christ. They've downscaled in some regards, and made sacrifices to keep meeting together, but a hunger for the Word of God motivates them to stay together. We ask you pray that the Lord would protect His little flock in Bertrand from harm and use them to shine for Jesus in their community.

Technologies

Similar to other AFLC departments, Home Missions subscribes to GoToMeeting for online phone conferencing and meetings. We use this service for all our Home Missions Committee meetings, as well as our monthly Parish Builder "Team Talk." Soon we'll be adding a monthly conference call for Home Mission pastors. GoToMeeting significantly reduces long distance charges, while providing crisp voice and video conferencing.

We continue to learn how to make the best use of our Home Mission website, social media, and Knee Mail subscriptions to keep in contact with our supporters. Parish Builder training sessions are being uploaded to the internet for pastors and congregations to utilize.

Leadership Retreat

This past January we had a wonderful leadership conference with key note speaker Pastor Eric Barger, from Take a Stand Ministries. Eric educated, equipped, and encouraged us with tools to identify and stand up against prevalent dangers confronting our congregations. I recommend his teaching as a fabulous resource for our entire AFLC family. The Home Missions Committee desires to hold future annual leadership training, but we are asking the question of whether we should change the format and location to better meet needs of Home Mission pastors and lay leadership. We seek the Lord for guidance, and appreciate your input as we seek the best solution.

Budget

This is an area in which we continue to thank the Lord for His faithfulness. You, our AFLC family, remain generous and gracious in your prayer and financial support. We can never begin to say thank you enough for your vision to see more living congregations established across our land. Thank you for the privilege of serving you.

We are submitting a budget of \$797,131, and a conference subsidy of \$604,631. We look to the Lord to meet our needs and to give us wisdom on how proceed through doors He opens for us. We strive to be frugal. Please continue to pray for us as we move ahead in the future.

Barnabas Teams

The North and South Barnabas teams are sent out by Home Missions for 10 weeks each summer, and focus on teaching Vacation Bible School, sharing testimonies, and building relationships within primarily Home Mission congregations. Home Missions chose the name "Barnabas" because of its meaning—"Son of Encouragement." We are grateful for the partnership we have with the Bible school in training, equipping, and sending these summer teams. It's a joy to work with Pastor Joel Rolf and Chad Friestad; the unity of spirit we experience is a special blessing from God. Summer team preparation, training, and back-up support takes a lot of time, but we believe it's time well spent towards the cause of building up our congregations.

We are grateful for the parents that have raised these young adults and sent them to Bible School, as well as the congregations and pastors that have invested in them. Our 2012 South Barnabas team members are Josiah Nelson, Andrew Kneeland, Esther Long, and Rachael Ballmann. The 2012 North Barnabas team is Kyle Smith, Tim Papillon, Courtney Jacobsen, and

Krista Heylens. Please keep them in your prayers. Thank you, 2012 teams, for your life-on-life investment this summer!

Parish Builders

We've had a faithful team of Parish Builders the past 12 months. Each one is bringing Christ into communities and parishes through selfless service and assisting Home Mission pastors. I couldn't ask to serve with a better group. Thank you for pouring yourself out for the King. The official list of Parish Builders since last conference include Ashley Hurner, Amanda Bellefy, Jordan and Rachel Rumohr, Mark and Barb Gustafson, Ryan Tonneson, Stephen Quanbeck, Hannah Johnson, Ben Dahl, Jared Langness, Jerry and Terry Nelson, Luke and Kelly Emerson, Stephanie Nelson, Michael Osthus, and Kayla Paige.

Of these, Jerry and Terry Nelson have now transitioned from Parish Building to serve on staff at Good Shepherd Free Lutheran in Cokato, MN. Mark and Barb Gustafson have also transitioned to a church staff position at Calvary Free Lutheran in Mesa, AZ. Kayla, Stephanie, and Michael have all completed their 1 year commitment at Good Shepherd in Madison, SD, and Ryan Tonneson moved to Minneapolis to begin study at the AFLC seminary.

We are in contact with others that have caught a vision for Parish Building and are serving in a similar capacity in non-Home Mission congregations. We thank God for these servants too.

Some of the ongoing training topics we've offered to our Parish Builders via monthly Team Talk web conferencing include: ministry to grieving, home visitations, partnering with ministry sponsors, time management in ministry, hospitality, plus much more. We feature guest presenters for each topic... someone we consider an expert in that area. Our longest distance presenter was missionary Joni Sliver, joining us all the way from Brazil.

Last year, the Home Missions Committee voted to open up our Parish Builder training to non-Home Missions ministry workers. This means that staff and volunteers from non-mission congregations are invited to register for participation in our annual training week at the AFLC Headquarters in Plymouth, MN. Our next training week is tentatively scheduled for the last week of August.

Seminary Training

January 2012 I was able to teach an intensive 1-week class at AFLTS entitled, Church Planting and Development. What a joy it is to see the hunger these students have for learning and teaching the Word of God. Praise the Lord! We are grateful for each one of these seminarians and their families.

I personally want to encourage our AFLC family to pray for these men, as they seek the Lord's will for their future ministry. I'm encouraged by the nine new seminarians in class this year. Some of them came from Home Mission congregations and/or trained with us for Parish Building or summer teams. ANNUAL REPORT OF THE FREE LUTHERAN ASSOCIATION OF PILOT SUPPORTERS, INC.

To the fiftieth annual conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations gathered in Thief River Falls, MN June 12-15, 2012.

What a joy and privilege it is to be a part of the fiftieth anniversary of the organization of the AFLC! God has richly blessed the work of the AFLC and its various ministries during those years.

Although the FLAPS ministry has only been in existence about one fourth of those years, God's hand has certainly been upon this ministry as well. Many hours have been flown during that time as airplanes are used as tools for ministry.

The use of small airplanes for ministry began in earnest right after WWII when a number of Christian military pilots felt God's leading in the use of small airplanes to carry the good news of the Gospel to people in remote areas of the world.

Over the years, the use of airplanes by a many mission aviation organizations in a number of countries has resulted in untold numbers of souls being reached for Christ. That work continues today with the FLAPS ministry in Alaska, where roads are non-existent in most of the state where many isolated villages are located. Souls continue to be saved there as a result of using airplanes as evangelism tools. Thank God for His faithfulness over the years! "For great is your love, reaching to the heavens; your faithfulness reaches to the skies." (Ps. 57:10).

As the mission work in southwest Alaska continues to expand, the need for mission flight activity has also increased. As a result, FLAPS placed a second airplane, a Piper Cherokee Six, in Alaska in early September of 2011. This airplane had been based in Minneapolis, MN since 2001 and was actively used for ministry in the "lower forty-eight" states. Its greater seating capacity and cargo hauling capability have already proven to be a great asset for the ministry there with the transporting of village youth to Bible Camp in the summer, carrying mission personnel to villages, and in carrying supplies of various types. With its greater payload capability, more passengers and cargo can be hauled which often results in fewer trips needing to be flown.

Both the Cessna 175 and the Piper Cherokee Six planes can be put in the Naknek hangar at one time. However, the greater size and weight of the Cherokee Six makes it more difficult to physically push it in and pull it out of the hangar building. This is particularly true when the ground is icy and slick on the inclined approach to the hangar. Just recently we were advised that a

fellow aviation mission organization who uses the hangar on occasion, is planning to give a gift to FLAPS enabling us to purchase a heavy duty motorized tug that will be able to move the planes around safely, even when the ground is snowy and icy. Once again, we thank God for His provision!

We are very grateful for a gift of \$10,000 received from Lutheran Mission Society last winter to be used for the purchase of aviation fuel for the two FLAPS airplanes based in Naknek, Alaska. This is a wonderful blessing and we are very thankful for this generous gift.

The Minneapolis based Cessna 182 gifted to FLAPS about five years ago, is our "flagship" for mission aviation operations in the "lower forty-eight" states. God continues to provide the resources needed to keep this flying ministry operating smoothly. We thank God for a Christian aircraft mechanic who has faithfully taken care of most of the maintenance for our Minneapolis based planes for about the last nine years. He has been very helpful in keeping our aircraft maintenance costs down.

Since many of our congregations in the lower "forty-eight" states are located in rural areas not served by airlines, the Cessna 182 is particularly useful for flying staff personnel out to these areas to assist local congregations with ministry needs.

Several years ago, an Aviation Track was added to the Ministry Training Institute curriculum in the Association of Free Lutheran Bible School. In this program, the fall semester is spent on campus in Minneapolis and the second semester field experience is spent on the mission field in Alaska. In the 2010-2011 academic year, one of the MTI students took the Aviation Track and completed the program in June, 2011. This track provides an opportunity for the MTI student to study and work in the area of mission aviation to help determine if this is where the Lord is leading them in their lives.

Thanks to all who continue to make this ministry possible through gifts and prayers. We pray that God's hand of blessing would continue to be on not only this aviation ministry, but also on all the ministries in the AFLC as we enter the second half century of ministry.

Our WMF theme these days is taken from I Samuel 7:12: "Then Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Shen; and called its name Ebenezer, saying, 'Thus far the Lord has helped us." As we celebrate this 50th anniversary of the Women's Missionary Federation of the AFLC, we acknowledge it is only with the Lord's help that we have been allowed to continue and grow as we have. Without the Lord Jesus Christ, we would not be the AFLC that we are today.

We have already had opportunity to celebrate this anniversary back in March with a special women's retreat held at the ARC under the theme of "Jesus - Yesterday, Today, Forever" taken from Hebrews 13:8. We thank God for each of the 92 women who were present and pray that the events of that weekend will continue to bear fruit in the lives of these women.

The WMF Bible Study for 2012 is <u>Pearls for a Princess</u>, written by Faylin Myhre from Abercrombie, ND, our former Women's Outreach Coordinator. We make every effort to have Biblically-sound, Lutheran Bible studies available. The cost is very competitive with most other materials available in Christian bookstores or on websites. I pray that each and every one of you will take advantage of these Bible studies. I know you will be blessed! Remember these studies are written by women of the AFLC who hold to the tenets of the Lutheran faith, and who most of all love the Lord our God.

We have several publications – some online and others in printed format. Our **WMF e-news** is posted to the internet as a blog which is accessed through a link on our website: www.aflc.org/women. We also have a blog for pastors' wives, **Heartline**, which is available through a link on the same website. Our website is also a place where news, devotional articles and other information is posted each month. We have a print newsletter, the **Helping Hand**, which is sent out every three months.

The WMF of the AFLC has received a grant from Thrivent Financial for Lutherans for the purpose of providing **every congregation** in the AFLC with a Resource Manual for WMF. This manual is available at this conference and is for every congregation whether or not you have an organized WMF.

Please have your WMF president or a representative from your WMF come to our display area when we are present and pick up their manual if they have not already done so.

Your gifts to the WMF support four separate ministries: Christian Education (Parish Education, AFLBS, AFLTS, and Cradle Roll), World Missions, Home Missions, and the WMF General Fund. Each fall at the All Boards meetings, the WMF board meets with the directors/leaders of the various ministries we support to determine the needs of each of the ministries that we support.

Our 2012 contributions to **Parish Education** will first be used for completing publication of the 6th grade Sunday school teacher's manual, and when that is complete they will go toward 8th grade Sunday School material.

Your gifts to **AFLBS** will go toward replacing the kitchenette in the men's dorm lounge, then toward furniture accessory pieces for Heritage Hall and the men's dorm, with the balance toward campus surveillance cameras.

Your gifts designated to **AFLTS** in 2012 will go to the Book Fund and the balance of receipts will be used toward the continuing education of the seminary faculty.

Cradle Roll packets can be used as a means of ministry to the parents of new babies in your congregation as well as a means of outreach to families in your community. The packets contain Biblically-sound brochures with encouragement to raise a child in the Word of God. You can order these packets through the WMF Executive Secretary, Dawn Johnson.

The WMF is committed to provide \$500.00 per month in salary support for each of the seven missionary units of **World Missions**. We are also committed to providing support to the Short Term Assistants as requested by each of the assistants. The Mission Scholarship Fund is a fund available particularly to seminarians who have been approved as missionary candidates by the World Missions Committee. These funds can be applied for through the application we have available. The funds are also available to seminary wives who are approved missionary candidates in order for them to pursue courses in Bible and other mission related education that would aid them while they are on the mission field.

Home Missions has its own unique mission work in congregations throughout the United States, including the radio and aviation ministry in Alaska. Parish Builders ministry is part of the Home Missions ministry. We are giving ½ of the receipts for Home Missions to Parish Builders training and the other ½ of the receipts will go to the ministry in Alaska particularly pointed toward radio ministry and aviation.

The **General Fund** is contributed to by the women of the AFLC very generously and enables us to continue ministering to the women of the AFLC. Part of this fund goes toward operating expenses and publication costs. One of our big needs right now is new computers. We also are committed to contribute to the AFLC for the salary of the Development Director. We must take those funds out of our General Fund as well.

God has been good to the WMF in giving us wonderful officers who love the Lord Jesus Christ. This year we say good bye to Mary Ann Ward, corresponding secretary, who has decided not to run for a second term on the WMF Board. I will also be saying farewell to the WMF board as the president. I pray that the work that God has allowed us to do would continue to bear fruit for His kingdom.

God has blessed the AFLC and the Women's Missionary Federation of the AFLC for the past 50 years. "Thus far the Lord has helped us." Let us continue to seek His will in all things and allow Him to help us in the years to come.

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON EVANGELISM

To the fiftieth Annual Convention of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations assembled in Thief River Falls, MN June 12-15, 2012. Happy golden anniversary!

"Devote yourselves to prayer, keeping alert in it with an attitude of thanks-giving; praying at the same time for us as well, that God will open up to us a door for the word, so that we may speak forth the mystery of Christ, for which I have also been imprisoned; that I may make it clear in the way I ought to speak" (Colossians 4:2-4).

What does the Apostle Paul want prayer for in the above verses? He wants God to open a door for the Word. Why? So that he can speak forth the mystery of Christ and make it clear. Why does he need prayer for that? According to Second Corinthians 4:3-4, the Gospel is veiled to those who are perishing and the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelieving. Colossians 2:2-3 say that the mystery is Christ, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. Paul knew he needed God to open the eyes of the unbelieving so that they could even begin to hear the message. He knew that the Gospel was and is the power of God unto salvation for all who believe.

As congregations it is vital to pray for the unbelievers that surround us and seek ways to engage them with the Gospel. The Commission on Evangelism (COE) spends much time in prayer seeking ways that we can come along side our congregations to encourage and challenge them to be about the great commission. Evangelism and discipleship are the primary purposes of the local congregation but today's culture makes it much too easy to focus on other things.

The COE board recently extended their time in prayer in order to revamp its mission and vision. Our mission is very simple: "Equipping disciples to be passionate for evangelism." We then considered what this mission might look like as it is being fulfilled. That brought us to our new vision statement: "By the power of the Holy Spirit we will see a contagious excitement for evangelism with every congregation experiencing a multiplication of disciples." It is exciting to think what the AFLC could look like in another fifty years. Perhaps we will be congregating on streets of gold?

The Commission on Evangelism continues to provide evangelism tools as well as the training to use these tools along with a downloadable Discipleship Manual birthed from an AFLTS assignment. We provide various workshops through our evangelism director, Pastor Jim

Rasmussen and annually conduct the Rekindling the Fire conference the Monday before Annual Conference to encourage pastors and their wives in their shepherding roles. Over the past year we have conducted several Red Thread Retreats in different AFLC districts. These are designed to give pastors and lay leaders a chance to consider and even brainstorm ways to make the great commission truly central in their church's ministry. We hope that every AFLC district will welcome this opportunity. We also distributed several thousands of dollars in Thrivent grants to assist congregations in various new evangelistic efforts.

We are thankful for the many faithful years of service that our director, Jim Rasmussen, has given. In addition to visiting and speaking in AFLC churches and districts, he has also taught at the seminary and Bible school. We are thankful for the many prayer warriors who faithfully uphold Jim and the ministry of the COE. We are grateful for the secretarial support of Chris Rasmussen and Kelly Emerson. Kelly will be leaving us June 1st of this year. We are privileged to have the guidance and assistance of the Coordinating Committee, President Elden Nelson and Vice President Michael Brandt. Finally, we were blessed to welcome new board member, Mr. Michael Lynnes, into our fold. He has a genuine heart for evangelism.

Without the generous prayer and financial support of many people and congregations the COE would not be able to conduct the work of evangelism to its current level. Prior to 2011, the COE was not officially under the banner of the Coordinating Committee and did not participate in their overhead expenses even though such expenses were incurred. The Coordinating Committee asked the COE to officially come under their banner in 2011 so that the COE would be treated the same as other AFLC ministries and that the expense of operation could be more realistically displayed. This increased our overhead in comparison to past budgets but also allowed us to collect a percentage of undesignated funds which more than offset that increase. Our prepared budget for 2013 is \$151,850. Please join us in prayer for a multiplication of disciples throughout our AFLC congregations.

How is your heart for the unsaved? This is the key to what the focus of your congregation should be. The Word of God is very clear on how God loves all human beings and He wants everyone to come to repentance. There is nothing on this side of eternity that gives more encouragement then to see

God work in someone's life and they surrender their lives to Jesus. I had the awesome privilege to be at FLY last summer and see God work in the largest AFLC gathering of 2011!

<u>Teaching</u>

This year I had the honor of having 57 students in the Evangelism/Discipleship class at AFLBS. This group was very excited to share Jesus with people. We made three trips to the Mall of America to tell people about Jesus. Also, this year I had the privilege to work with eleven seminary students in the Evangelism/Discipleship class at AFLTS. I tried to change the focus from simple lecture/teaching to more of a training format. I enjoyed it, I hope the men enjoyed it as I did!

Workshops

It was a great year where we had five "Share Jesus" training times in various congregations. It is fun to see people's eye light up when they begin to realize there is no pressure on them to save anyone. The responsibility is 100% on the Word & the Holy Spirit! When you use the "Share Jesus" tools you become the page turner and watch the Holy Spirit open up hearts and lives for Jesus!

There has been a renewed interest in the "Friend to Friend" training tool and as a result we have had the opportunity to do three training sessions. This tool is to help one see how everyone can be a part of living out the Great Commission in our everyday lives.

Retreats

It was good to be involved in six "Red Thread Retreats." We have found that the long term effectiveness is tied to how involved the lay people are in the retreats. My desire is that we will have a Red Thread Retreat in every district by our 51st Annual Conference!

The COE had a 24 hour retreat in which we prayed and spent time looking at the future of the COE. The Mission and Vision Statements were studied and changed. The Mission Statement is "Equipping disciples to be passionate for evangelism." The Vision Statement is "By the power of the Holy Spirit, we will see a contagious excitement for evangelism with every congregation experiencing a multiplication of disciples."

Training

This past February and March, I had the honor and challenge of being involved in developing what is being called an "Intentional Discipleship Training Institute" in St. Louis Park, MN. When I say "involved in developing," it is more in the idea I was the first "outsider" to be trained. I see much

potential in this type of training in the local congregation.

My desire is to see Discipleship Training be a part of the everyday life in the local congregation. Why? Because that is what the Great Commission is all about...Discipleship!

Rekindle The Fire

We had a blessed time last June in Sioux Falls, SD as Dr. H.B. London shared from his heart to encourage and challenge those pastors and wives that attended. We were blessed by the Master's Voice quartet from the Sioux Falls area as the music for the banquet. We had delicious pie made by Wade Mobley's mom for dessert!

REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN, BOARD OF PUBLICATIONS AND PARISH EDUCATION

To the Fiftieth Annual Conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations assembled in Thief River Falls, MN, June 15-18, 2012.

This year's Conference verse, "This is the Lord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes," is more than appropriate as we look back on 50 years of ministry in our AFLC. The Department of Publications and Parish Education was established early in our history to primarily provide Biblical, Lutheran materials for our Sunday Schools. And whatever has been accomplished in those 50 years, whatever is currently part of our ministry, and whatever vision and goals we have for the future are, and will be "the Lord's doing". We stand here today humbly recognizing that all we are and have is from our gracious God. "It is marvelous in our eyes" to see the Lord's Hand in the entire work of the AFLC.

As I reported to you last year, our department continues to be understaffed due primarily to a lack of sufficient funds. Adding a full-time assistant director is essential. We see this person assisting our director in two primary ways. First, to perhaps take over some of the administrative office work so Marian can devote more of her time to our publishing projects themselves—working with project volunteers, editing, reviewing, formatting, etc. Second, we want to make more regular, personal contacts with our congregations to present the ministry of Ambassador Publications and inform the people of the AFLC about the materials we can provide, as well as offer more Christian education workshops. Our board is fully aware that if this is to happen it will be "the Lord's doing".

Unlike many larger publishing houses, Ambassador Publications is not a self-sustaining ministry. Although we have sales income which has steadily increased over the past several years, this does not come close to meeting all of our financial needs. We are absolutely dependent on God's people to support and subsidize our ministry with their prayerful and sacrificial gifts.

The Board of Publications and Parish Education respectfully requests the Annual Conference to approve a budget for 2013 of \$173, 981. This represents a slight increase over the 2012 budget subsidy request (about 5%).

As a board, we extend our special thanks and deep appreciation to the four individuals who work for our department. Our director, Marian

Christopherson, continues to serve our congregations well and gives more to the ministry than anyone really knows. This year we were able to re-hire Miss Diane Brubakken to work in a part-time position as secretary. Diane had worked for us previously, but had to leave her job for personal reasons. It has been a delight to have her enthusiasm and dedication back in our office again. Our other on-site office assistant, Mr. Brent Raan, a student at AFLTS, handles much of our billing and ordering. His passion for the ministry shines through daily in interaction with staff and board members, along with the customer care he provides. Mrs. Sarah Daas remains on the payroll working part-time from home on various important projects that fit her skills.

The members of the Board of Publications and Parish Education are Pastor John Mundfrom, Chairman; Mrs. Candice Johnson, Vice-Chairman; Mrs. Bonnie Handsaker, Secretary, Mrs. Andrea Christenson, and Pastor Sam Wellumson. The term of Mrs. Candice Johnson expires this year, and she is eligible for re-election.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLICATIONS AND PARISH EDUCATION

To the Annual Conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations gathered in Thief River Falls, Minnesota, June 12-15, 2012:

As we celebrate fifty years together as an Association of Free Lutheran Congregations, we give thanks to God for what He has done in and through our congregations. As we eagerly anticipate what God will do in the future and continue to partner together through various AFLC ministries, we pray that God will keep us standing firm on the Word and that the Gospel will continue to go forth for the furtherance of His kingdom.

When we reflect on God's faithfulness throughout the history of the Parish Education Department, we give thanks to God for what has been accomplished by His grace and strength. To God be the glory! Some of the following highlights from the past five decades demonstrate God's faithfulness and show how things have changed over the years, but more importantly, how they have not changed.

The first Committee on Publications and Parish Education mentioned in the 1963 Annual Report consisted of Rev. Raynard Huglen, Mr. Lee Quanbeck, and Mrs. Betty Nelson. Mrs. Helen Hanson served as the first Executive Secretary beginning in 1966. She was followed by Miss Judith Wold in 1969, who served 12 years and for a time served as both the Executive Secretary of the Parish Education Department and of the Women's Missionary Federation.

Early in the history of the AFLC, the Annual Conference encouraged the Board of Publications to produce our own Sunday School curriculum, which later became known as the Ambassador Sunday School Series. During the late 1960s and throughout the 1970s, the Parish Education office was located in Thief River Falls, Minnesota. Judith, the board, and a large number of volunteers produced a prolific amount of material during those early years, publishing Sunday School curriculum for grades two through nine as well as teen, adult, and confirmation quarterlies. A devotional book, *Waters in the Wilderness*, was published in 1971, and the Beginner's Series I and II preschool curriculum was published in 1978 and 1979.

The 1980s brought some significant changes for Parish Education. The Annual Conference of 1981 passed a resolution to revise and produce

our Sunday School materials in color. This had been the desire from the beginning, and now God was providing the funding and resources. In 1986, Mrs. Katha Tjelta was called as the first "Director" of Parish Education and served until 1996. Katha was instrumental in revising and printing the first color curriculum for Grades 2 and 4. In addition, the first catalog was published. The Parish Education office moved to Plymouth, Minnesota. The computer was put to use in limited ways, including accounts receivable and text files of the Bible lessons. Another notable change came in 1988 when Parish Education was given its own budget as a department, though still remaining under the Coordinating Committee Corporation.

The 1990s saw a gradual transition from typewriters to PCs. Full-color catechism teaching wall posters were created to correlate with our Sunday School curriculum and confirmation materials, and the catalog was expanded to include some teaching resources not specifically published by the Board of Publications and Parish Education. When I started serving as director in 1996, preliminary work had begun on new Kindergarten and Grade 1 curriculum, which was completed in 1997 and 1998. The editing process began to transition from pen and paper and typewritten copies to electronic files, and email started to appear on the horizon. The AFLC Heritage Series was established with the publication of the first volume in 1999, entitled *Romans: A Devotional Commentary* by C. O. Rosenius.

In the new millennium, the Parish Education Department began publishing an adult study series called the Ambassador Bible Study Series, beginning with I, II, III John. More curriculum was revised and printed in full color: Grade 3 in 2003. Preschool in 2005, and Grade 5 in 2008. By this time, modern technology was transforming the way we functioned as a department. With the growing use of email. correspondence with volunteers could be done more quickly since we did not have to wait for mail to be delivered between our department and an author. With greater access to the internet, customers could view our catalog online, and many orders were being made via email instead of phone or mail order. The Spanish translation of our Sunday School material was made available on the internet for download. And the board began using online resources such as GoToMeeting and Googledocs for editing and meeting purposes. One of the biggest printing projects was the re-publication of Luther's Small Catechism and Explanation in 2007 with updated language, NASB Scriptures, and reproductions of the full-color posters.

There have been many changes throughout the years for the Parish Education Department, but one thing has remained the same: We have

kept the Word of God central, upholding it as infallible and inerrant. As we continue to move forward with publishing more curriculum and Bible studies, our prayer is that God's Word and the wonderful Gospel message would be effectively communicated through all the materials we provide.

During this past year, a tremendous amount of time has been expended by staff, board members, and volunteers on various aspects of the new Grade 6 curriculum. Though we have been very focused on this work, much remains to be done. In addition to regular two-day meetings on campus about every six weeks, for several months the board has also been holding online meetings through GoToMeeting.com, often two days a week for several hours at a time, mainly to edit Grade 6 Bible lessons. We are praying that God would bring this project to completion soon. Work also continues on curriculum for Grades 7-9, confirmation materials, and youth and adult Bible studies, but none of these are ready for publication.

A new devotional book is being prepared in commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the AFLC. This book entitled *Threads of Grace* is a collection of bulletin articles from the past 25 years and is intended to encourage believers in a daily devotional life.

The third volume in the AFLC Heritage Series was printed in 2011. Translated from the Finnish, *They Lived in the Power of God: Lutheran Revival Leaders in Northern Europe* is a historic collection of biographical writings by Dr. Uuras Saarnivaara on Lutheran pietists from Germany, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, and Finland. We are grateful to translators Rodger and Aila Foltz for their patience, cooperation, and perseverance throughout the extensive translating and editing process. These fascinating biographies on Johann Arndt, Jakob Spener, C. O. Rosenius, Hans Nielsen Hauge, Ole Hallesby, and many others, reflect our spiritual heritage and are accompanied by informative, historical introductions and maps. Congregations are encouraged to obtain a copy for their church libraries.

A PowerPoint CD about the ministry of Ambassador Publications was produced during the past year and sent to all AFLC congregations. Since it is impossible for us to travel to every congregation, we hope that congregations would take the time to share this CD in a group setting to help inform individuals about the ways they can participate in the ministry of Parish Education and about how we can serve them.

New portable banner displays were created (funded by a 2010

Foundation grant) and have gotten much use during the past year at various events. A new catalog was printed in the summer of 2011 and sent to all AFLC congregations as well as to approximately 626 other congregations affiliated with Lutheran groups who do not have their own Sunday School curriculum, including Church of the Lutheran Brethren (LB), American Association of Lutheran Churches (AALC), and Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC).

Work continues with our online bookstore. Numerous glitches in relation to integration with our current database system have greatly inhibited our progress, but we are still hopeful it will become a reality soon. We continue to explore other ways (such as apps and e-books) that we can use technology to increase our visibility and better serve our congregations. We recently established our own facebook page and encourage people to join us there.

Every year we have numerous opportunities to host book displays and participate in important ministry events such as conventions, WMF rallies, and Christian Education workshops, and we pray that God would use the resources we provide for His honor and glory. Last fall we had a book display at the annual LCMC convention and were thankful for many occasions to show attendees our Bible-based, Christ-centered curriculum and other books. We pray that God will continue to broaden the use of our excellent resources for the furtherance of His kingdom.

We are grateful for God's provision and for the generosity of donors through two grants we received this year. A \$3,600 grant from the AFLC Foundation enabled us to purchase new computers and other needed office equipment. A \$4,000 Thrivent grant will be used towards the publication of the new Grade 6 student book.

Our part-time staff are deserving of much praise for their cheerful and diligent service. It is a joy to work in partnership with them. Secretary Sarah Daas left to have a baby in the spring of 2011 but continues working a few hours a week from home, maintaining our website, making contacts for bulletin articles, and assisting with certain projects. Brent Raan and Diane Brubakken currently work part-time in the office Monday through Friday. Brent attends seminary classes in the morning and works in the office in the afternoon, entering orders in the computer, running computer reports, and helping to manage inventory. Diane works in the office primarily in the morning and is also employed locally as a massage therapist. Diane assists with volunteer contacts, correspondence, and formatting books for publishing. Both Brent and Diane help customers in the store as well as by phone and email. They also fill and ship orders and pack and unpack books for workshops and other events, in addition to

multiple other tasks. Their dedication is certainly commendable!

Thank you to the WMF for their faithful support through prayers and gifts and to many others who have prayed and given during the past year. We thank God for every one of you. Thank you to each member of the Board of Publications, who generously gives of time and talents in the name of Christ in order to serve our congregations by providing biblical, Lutheran, educational and devotional resources: Mrs. Andrea Christenson, Mrs. Bonnie Handsaker, Mrs. Candice Johnson, Rev. John Mundfrom, and Rev. Sam Wellumson. As we serve together, may God continue to preserve, guide, and bless the ministry of Ambassador Publications for His honor and glory.

In order to continue solid, stable, vision-minded ministry we request a budget of \$120,000 for 2013.

To the Fiftieth Annual Conference of the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations, assembled in Thief River Falls, Minnesota, on June 12-15, 2012.

Each Free Lutheran Youth Convention provides opportunities to proclaim, "This is the LORD'sdoing; It is marvelous in our eyes" (Psalm 118:23). Those words can be appropriately applied to the most recent FLY Convention in the summer of 2011. Approximately 1,800 students, counselors, staff, and adults gathered under the theme "It is Written," taken from John 20:30-31. All who attended the Convention were exposed to the truths of God's Word through evening sessions, morning Bible study hours, elective times, and dorm rooms. Praise the Lord for His work in "transferring many into the kingdom of His beloved Son!" (Colossians 1:13). Many went home from Colorado with a renewed zeal to submit to God's ways for all of life. Thank you to the wonderful team of people that gave of their time and talents as counselors, staff, or speaker. We praise the Lord for using you as an instrument in His hands!

The 2013 FLY Convention is coming soon. It will be held 13 months from now at the YMCA of the Rockies in Estes Park, Colorado, on July 1st -6th. The theme chosen by the Committee is "Broken," taken from Isaiah 53. After much prayer and thinking though the status of the youth of the nation, the 2013 FLY Committee was led to this theme. So much of what youth face today is broken - their friendships, families, and themselves. Where can one go to find hope and healing in the midst of all this brokenness? Those members are President Pastor Brett Boe of Dalton, MN; 1st Vice President David Olson of Sioux Falls, SD; 2nd Vice President Nathan Olson of Plymouth, MN; Devotional Life Secretary Jon Langness of Maple Grove, MN; and Christina Osthus of Eagle Butte, SD. Treasurer Jon Nelson of Kalispell, MT, appointed by the Committee, is also a voting member. Three advisors to the Committee join in the planning process. Sharon Rykhus of Sioux Falls, SD holds the position of Youth Board representative; Chris Rasmussen, AFLC Receptionist Administrative Assistant assists the Committee; and Pastor

Jason Holt, Director of Youth Ministries, comes alongside the Committee. Together these nine people meet every six to eight weeks to plan the 2013 FLY Convention.

The purpose of the FLY Convention is to provide congregations with a tool for winning the lost, building the believer, and encouraging student disciple making in the local congregation. We have sought to craft the Convention in such a way that this purpose is accomplished. This "tool" in the hands of the Lord has been used to unite young and old in congregations through the details of preparing to go, the actual week at camp, and the follow-up that happens after camp. Congregations around the country do much to prepare for this special week. We are praying for you as your congregation makes plans to attend FLY 2013. We praise the Lord for how He has brought about spiritual life in people through the FLY Convention.

The first year of planning has come to a close. At each meeting we gather as a Committee to hear from the Word, pray, and work on our agenda items. The first year of the planning process involves laying the groundwork for the FLY Convention. The theme has been chosen and the logo has been selected among other details. Evening and morning speakers, schedules, and staff have been highlights of our planning up to this point. At the time this report was submitted, these evening speakers have agreed to preach the Word: Pastor Michael Brandt of Sioux Falls, SD; Jeremy Erickson of Minneapolis, MN; Adam Osier of Bethel Park, PA; Joshua and Amy Skogerboe of Plymouth, MN; and Pastor Bryan Wolfmueller of Aurora, CO. We are looking forward to how God will speak His healing truths through these speakers. Would you join us in praying for them as they prepare?

During the Youth Worker's Retreat this past January at the ARC, the biennial FLY Federation Council meeting took place. Representatives from six of the districts participated in this meeting, bringing valuable feedback from their district to the 2013 FLY Committee. The Committee takes seriously the thoughts and ideas brought forward at this meeting and often weaves these ideas into the planning of FLY 2013. The FLY Federation Council approved the 2013 FLY Working Budget. The next meeting will be held in January 2014. Please consider sending a representative from your district.

We are anticipating close to 2,000 attendees. The majority of these attenders will be students and the rest will be counselors, staff, adults, and children. The YMCA remains a wonderful setting for the Convention. Improvements and renovations continue to be made to this campus. I, along with the rest of the FLY Committee, invite you to attend next

summer. If you are curious about learning more about the FLY Convention, please check out our new website, www.flyconvention.org. You will find videos, pictures, and vital information.

We ask that you keep the 2013 FLY Convention in prayer. There are many more details that need to be attended to by the FLY Committee before we all descend upon the YMCA campus. This Psalm provides us a look at the past in what He has done as well as a look to today in what He is doing. In addition, we are shown a strong response by His people – a response of gladness because of Him.

AFLC Youth Ministries appreciates the areas of emphasis involved here. With the perspective of sharing Jesus with each generation of young people, we find that the Lord has been faithful through "the stone that the builders rejected". He continues to stand today holding out that message to those that would receive Him. We rejoice that the Lord has impacted multiple waves of youth during our years as an AFLC and we are confident in His working in the lives of teenagers today

STICKY FAITH

One book that has grabbed our attention in the last year is "Sticky Faith" by Dr. Kara Powell et al. Dr. Powell and colleagues at Fuller Youth Institute researched what leads teenagers into a faith that "sticks". In other words, in contrast to the volume of materials unearthing the issues connecting Christ to this generation of youth, FYI examined elements that lead teenagers to become adults that were devoted to the Lord. The range of findings and practical insights on applying them are contained in the book and in online tools. Each attendee at the 2012 AFLC Youth Workers Retreat was given a copy of the book.

In a video interview, Dr. Powell summarized their key findings with three categories: sticky Gospel, sticky families, and sticky churches. She described "sticky Gospel" as being clear on the guilt of our sin and the grace of our God. We are grateful in our fellowship for the heritage of being clear on the law and the Gospel.

Second, she indicated that "sticky families" were ones that worshipped together and wove faith into all areas of life. Dr. Powell mentioned that it is good to

have parents of teens ASKING their children about what they are learning as well as how they are growing through Sunday School and youth ministry, but their findings also put a high value on the parents TELLING their children what they are learning as well as how they are growing as adults in their walk with Jesus.

Third, "sticky churches" were ones that placed a priority on caring adults involved in the lives of youth and children. This area underscores everything from narthex conversations to international relationships of godly adults regularly connecting with teenagers. Do you hear with me the tones from last year's Annual Conference theme, "Generations Walking Together"?

AFLC Youth Ministries' established mission consistently parallels these findings. We are focused on winning teenagers to Christ through the "sticky Gospel". We are also committed to building teenagers through God's Word and God's love in both "sticky families" and "sticky churches". Our ownership of equipping teenagers to share their faith with others and live their faith by grace depends on all three "sticky" elements. May we see an ever-increasing movement of spiritual life in the youth of our congregations through our Lord Jesus!

WIN

When it comes to teenagers, their first need will always be a saving relationship with Jesus. Although a majority of American adolescents would answer a survey that they believe in "God", it has been demonstrated that a great number of them are not clear on who Jesus is or how this relationship is formed. We have a great opportunity to communicate Christ to today's youth!

The Free Lutheran Youth Convention (FLY Convention) is our national youth gathering and it keeps this priority strong within its mission. The evening sessions of each FLY Convention are evangelistic in nature to provide a setting to invite teenagers through the law and the Gospel to accept Jesus. FLY President Pastor Brett Boe's annual report speaks to the development of the convention week for July 1-6, 2013.

We readily recognize that the FLY Convention happens only once every two years, so we gladly partner with local and district efforts to share the Gospel. Since last year's report, we were able to partner in youth ministry including camps, retreats, and day-long events in eleven states.

BUILD

One may ask the question, "What should a youth leader focus on when working with youth?"

The answer is found in the life and ministry of Jesus. We find Jesus in the Gospel accounts prioritizing time on the Word, time in prayer, time with people, and time defining living. These four keys – studying, praying, loving, and living – can shape the typical youth ministry setting. With these four keys and Jesus as the center, our teenagers will be truly built up in their faith.

We continue to encourage congregations and districts to envision ways to give teenagers this environment for nurturing faith. This approach can happen in age-appropriate settings, multigenerational efforts, and gender specific training (men alongside boys; women alongside girls). The point is not which one happens, but that it happens. The local congregation must place a priority on passing on the faith through the involvement of parents and adults in teenagers' lives.

EQUIP

AFLC Youth Ministries takes seriously our role to equip both teens and youth leaders. FLY Beyond will be held July 16-20, 2012 at the Association Retreat Center (ARC). Galatians 2:20 (ESV) states, "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." FLY Beyond will provide preaching and teaching to understand faith and life. It will also including training on leading others in studying God's Word and sharing one's faith in Christ. This valuable equipping conference has registration information at www.aflc.org/youth.

The 16th annual Youth Workers Retreat was held January 20-22, 2012 at the ARC. We enjoyed our largest attendance in its history with seventy people. The weekend was developed around focuses of personal renewal and ministry training. This event enables both vocational and volunteer youth leaders to gather and sharpen one another. The AFLC Youth Workers Retreat is a fraction of the cost of other national youth leader's events and it strengthens ties with other districts and congregations. Please consider paying part of the way for your volunteer or vocational youth leader to attend this excellent continuing education experience.

MULTIPLY

Multiplication of maturing teen disciples is a vital part of our process. Every

Christian is a Kingdom worker, but some the Lord calls to be Kingdom shepherds. If we limit our modeling with teenagers to Kingdom workers, then we could raise a generation removed from the sense that the Lord can call them to be Kingdom shepherds.

Our Student Missions area sent a team of eighteen to Ecuador on July 24 through August 17, 2011. With coordinators Sam & Rachel Menge, those involved were trained to lead others for the camp that was held and hosted by World Mission Prayer League staff. Even now almost a year later, the Student Missions team members are making it a priority to pray for one another. They have been granted a taste of leading. May our Lord call them into the areas of Kingdom work that He desires!

We will not have a Student Missions team this year as we enhance safety procedures and pursue new coordinators. Sam Menge continues his seminary training on internship. Thank you to Sam & Rachel Menge for your strong leadership for the past four years! Another area of leadership is our Young Adults blog (grounded317.blogspot.com). A team of young adult authors write about life and faith in Christ. Our goal is to multiply opportunities that assist in serving Jesus for a lifetime.

Our celebration of what the Lord has done includes recognizing the brothers and sisters in Christ that have participated in this ministry. Thank you to the Youth Board for your teamwork in our efforts – Rev. Mark Johnson (Chairman), Mr. Jordan Langness (Vice Chair), Rev. Wade Mobley (Secretary), Mr. Dan Antal (Treasurer), and Mrs. Sharon Rykhus (FLY Liaison).

Thank you to the AFLC Receptionists / Administrative Assistants for your faithful service – Mrs. Kelly Emerson and Mrs. Chris Rasmussen. We are thankful for Kelly's three years of service and pray the Lord's blessings on her, Luke, Dylan, and Avery during Luke's seminary internship. Chris Rasmussen began on June 1st as the full-time AFLC Receptionist / Administrative Assistant, which is a shared position between the Coordinating Committee, the Commission on Evangelism, and the Youth Board. We are very grateful that this important role could return to a full-time position.

Each ministry opportunity within AFLC Youth Ministries is handled by a team of volunteers. We are so grateful for the burden and willingness of each one to partner in this way for the sake of Christ's Kingdom. Thank you to each one.

Thank you to my wife Jennifer. Each week-long conference, each youth weekend retreat, and each overnight lock-in, someone tends to mention how wonderful you are and they are 100% correct. Thank you to our children (Caleb, Susanna, Phoebe, Magdalena, and Micah). I am grateful to Jesus that I get to be involved in your lives and am praying for His leading for each one of you.

Fifty years of history remind us of the passing of time. The young men and women at that first gathering of the AFLC are now our respected leaders, teachers, and advisors. We can powerfully gain from this perspective by continuing to invest our lives in multiplying teen disciples of Jesus.

Pastor Buechler said a stand for marriage also calls us to speak to those who are hurt by sin.

Mr. Westrom said we should deal with this in two parts.

Pastor Jon Benson, Janesville, WI, said that we have dealt with these issues in past years. We are on record on this issue already.

Mrs. Amy Dalager, Argyle, MN, we cannot say we should speak in Christian love too many times.

Mrs. Karen Hart doesn't see why reiterating a stand on this issue should be any different than any other issue.

Amended adopted.

Speaking to the amended resolution:

Pastor Micah Hjermstad, Ishpeming, MI, was uncomfortable with having congregations take stands rather than taking individual stands on these issues.

Mrs. Amy Dalager, Argyle, MN, amend;

Mrs. Karen Hart, we cannot say who wants or doesn't want to come to Christ. Gay people often have only heard the Law and have not heard the Gospel. What wins people to Christ is the Gospel.

Pastor Michael F. Johnson, Alexandria, MN reminded us that we have decided to spend time in prayer for these contentious issues.

Rev. Richard Gunderson, Cambridge, MN, led the conference in prayer.

Rev. James Fugleberg, Moorhead, MN, said some resolutions appear as mandates, we can only recommend. These are important issues and they are public record.

Amendment carried.

Arriving in Germany, he found the discipline was very relaxed and he took advantage of this freedom by beginning to frequent the bars. Eventually Scott fell into the alcoholic tendencies of his biological Father.

After the Army his drinking got worse. This began to affect his work and he was fired from a couple of jobs for theft. As the drinking increased, so did the boldness for more dramatic thefts. The climax came when Scott decided to rob a restaurant. By God's grace he was caught immediately and was sentenced to 4 years in prison.

REDEEMED! In prison Scott couldn't run and came face to face with the ugly person that he had become. He came into contact with Christian inmates as well as volunteers from Prison Fellowship and the Salvation Army who shared the Gospel with him and began to challenge his life's direction. Jesus reached out through these men and took hold of Scott in His great mercy and He forgave him for all the terrible things he had done and the people he had hurt. His conversion was so radical, even Scott's cell mates were shocked.

After he was released from prison, a man named Pete Lundin invited him to come and live with he and his wife Sandy. Over the years they mentored Scott as a loving Father and Mother. They introduced him to his wife, Mary and they celebrated their 14th wedding anniversary this year having been blessed with four beautiful children. Through those formative years God provided Scott with many mentors at different stages in his spiritual growth.

The Lord began to give Scott opportunity to minister to others as he had been ministered to. It has been 19 years since he was saved in that prison cell. Now his strongest desire is to see others receive that same grace and life changing freedom.

Scott's pastor, Rich Carr, challenged him to consider seminary as he saw the impact the Lord had made on his life. He and his wife prayed about this and felt that this was the Lord's call. Scott enrolled at the Association of Free Lutheran's Seminary and upon completing his coursework was blessed to be assigned an internship at his home Church under Senior Pastor, Tom Parrish. Scott now looks forward to serving St. Ansgar's Lutheran Church in Salinas California as their family and youth pastor.

Scott would like to thank his loving wife, Mary who has stood beside him as a prayer partner and great encourager during the ups and downs. He would also like to thank those in his family who encouraged him including his Grandma, Carol Knapp, his Uncle and Aunt, Richard and Jani Knapp and his best friends, Alex and Rachel Chernyavsky who will be greatly missed. Special thanks to Pr. Tom Parrish for mentoring him.

AFLC FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES

(Guiding Principles of the Lutheran Free Church and the Association of Free Lutheran Congregations since 1897)

- 1. According to the Word of God, the congregation is the right form of the Kingdom of God on earth.
- 2. The congregation consists of believers who, by using the means of grace and the spiritual gifts as directed by the Word of God, seek salvation and eternal blessedness for themselves and for their fellow men.
- 3. According to the New Testament, the congregation needs an external organization with membership roll, election of officers, stated times and places for its gatherings, and other similar provisions.
- 4. Members of the organized congregation are not, in every instance believers, and such members often derive false hope from their external connection with the congregation. It is therefore the sacred obligation of the congregation to purify itself by the quickening preaching of the Word of God, by earnest admonition and exhortation, and by expelling the openly sinful and perverse.
- 5. The congregation directs its own affairs, subject to the authority of the Word and the Spirit of God, and acknowledges no other ecclesiastical authority or government above itself.
- 6. A free congregation esteems and cherishes all the spiritual gifts which the Lord gives for its edification, and seeks to stimulate and encourage their use.
- 7. A free congregation gladly accepts the mutual assistance which congregations can give one another in the work for the advancement of the Kingdom of God.
- 8. Such assistance consists partly in the mutual sharing of spiritual gifts among the congregations through conferences, exchange visits, lay activities, etc., whereby congregations are mutually edified, and partly in the voluntary and Spirit prompted cooperation of congregations for the accomplishing of such tasks as exceed the ability of the individual congregation.
- 9. Among such tasks may be mentioned specifically the training of pastors, distribution of Bible and other Christian literature, home missions, foreign missions, Jewish missions, deaconess homes, children's homes and other work of mercy.
- 10. Free congregations have no right to demand that other congregations shall submit to their opinion, will, judgment, or decision; therefore, domination by a majority of congregations over a minority is to be rejected.
- 11. Agencies found desirable for conducting the joint activities of congregations, such as conferences, committees, officers, etc., cannot in a Lutheran Free Church, impose any obligations or restrictions, exert any compulsions, or lay any burden upon the individual congregation, but have the right only to make recommendations to, and requests of, congregations and individuals.
- 12. Every free congregation, as well as every individual believer, is constrained by the Spirit of God and by the privileges of Christian love to do good and to work for the salvation of souls and the quickening of spiritual life, as far as its abilities and power permit. Such free spiritual activity is limited neither by parish nor by synodical bounds.

AFLC RULES FOR WORK

(As finally adopted at the AFLC Annual Conference in 1967)

- 1. The name of this association shall be "The Association of Free Lutheran Congregations."
- 2. Its aim shall be to work towards making Lutheran congregations free and living, so that, according to their calling and ability, they may work in spiritual freedom and autonomy for the cause of the Kingdom of God at home and abroad through such agencies and institutions as the congregations themselves may designate.
- 3. It endeavors to realize this aim in particular by training men and women for Christian work in and for the congregations, by conducting larger and smaller conferences, by distributing suitable literature, by organizing committees and societies, by sending out evangelists, and by any other means which from time to time will be found necessary or advisable.
- 4. The AFLC consists of congregations which, in their constitutions, unreservedly subscribe to the ancient ecumenical symbols, Luther's Small Catechism, the Unaltered Augsburg Confession, Fundamental Principles, and Rules for Work of the AFLC and report the same to the secretary of the Co-ordinating Committee.
- 5. The AFLC shall hold an Annual Conference which usually opens the evening of the second Wednesday in June and which shall elect the necessary committees and officers, and determine what church activities in particular it shall recommend to the congregations.
- 6. The right to vote in the Annual Conference of the AFLC shall be held by all ordained pastors and lay-pastors in regular standing in the AFLC and by all voting members of congregations affiliated with the AFLC. Individual Lutherans who are not members of a Lutheran congregation, but who are interested in supporting the work of the AFLC, may be granted speaking and voting privileges by the Co-ordinating Committee after said committee has received and approved their credentials. Voting members of other Lutheran congregations may be granted the right to vote in the Annual Conference providing they have at least two (2) weeks previously signed and sent to the secretary of the Annual Conference the special blank provided for that purpose, signifying that they approve the Fundamental Principles and Rules for Work of the AFLC and will work for aim set forth in Paragraph 2 of the Rules for Work.
- 7. The officers of the AFLC shall be a president, a vice-president, and a secretary, who shall be chosen from the membership of the AFLC and elected by the Annual Conference. Voting shall be by ballot.
 - a. The president shall be elected for a term of three years and shall devote all of his time to the service of the AFLC. He shall preside at the Annual Conference and shall report to it on the work of the AFLC in general, on church dedications, installations, celebrations, etc. He shall be an advisory member of all Boards and committees. He shall assist

congregations and pastors by giving counsel and guidance when this is desired, and he shall also, as Ordainer, assist the congregations in ordaining men with the proper and adequate training who have been duly called as pastors. His salary shall be determined by the Co-ordinating Committee and shall be paid out of the AFLC General Fund.

- b. The vice-president shall be elected for a term of one year and performs the duties of the president in the latter's absence.
- c. The secretary shall be elected for a term of one year. He shall keep the minutes of the Annual Conference and is the custodian of the archives.
- d. The term of office of the officers of the AFLC shall begin October 1, and shall expire September 30.
- e. The executive officers after having served three (3) consecutive terms can be elected for additional terms only by a three-fourths majority vote.
- 8. The Annual Conference shall nominate members of the Co-ordinating Committee. This committee shall consist of seven members: three (3) pastors and four (4) laymen chosen from the membership of the AFLC. The number of those whose terms expire shall determine the number to be nominated by the Annual Conference each year. No member can serve more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- 9. Duties of the Co-ordinating Committee.
 - a. The Co-ordinating Committee shall seek to make the Fundamental Principles and Rules for Work of the AFLC and further the discussions of the same throughout the congregations, so that the task of the AFLC, in an ever increasing degree, may be more clearly understood and more generally put into practice.
 - b. It shall seek to have the congregations as fully and as generally represented at the Annual Conference of the AFLC as possible.
 - c. When desired, it shall assist congregations and pastors by giving counsel and guidance.
 - d. It shall compile parochial statistics and report thereon to the Annual Conference. It shall maintain the clergy and congregational rosters of the AFLC.
 - e. It shall have charge of the AFLC General Fund from which shall be paid the salaries of the president, secretary, transportation secretary, traveling expenses, and expenses incurred in connection with the Annual Conference.

- f. It shall elect the editor of the church organ.
- g. Any duty not assigned to any other committee shall be the responsibility of the Co-ordinating Committee.
- 10. The Annual Conference shall nominate members for the following boards and corporations of the AFLC: Co-ordinating Committee, Board of Trustees and Corporation of the Free Lutheran Theological Seminary, Board and Corporation of Missions, Board of Publications and Parish Education, Youth Board, Stewardship Board, and (Benefits Board) Pension Board. The editor of the church organ shall also be nominated by the Annual Conference.
 - a. No member can serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- 11. Reports shall be given by the following at the Annual Conference of the AFLC: The President, the Co-ordinating Committee, Board of Missions, Schools, (Benefits Board) Board of Pensions, Board of Publications and Parish Education, Youth Board, (FLY) Luther League Federation, special committees elected by the Annual Conference, and by such institutions and activities within the church as may be given permission to report to the Annual Conference.
- 12. The president and secretary shall constitute the Annual Conference Committee, whose duties shall be: To fix time and place of the Annual Conference in the event that the-Annual Conference did not do so, at least 2 years in advance; arrange the program for the Conference, prepare the calendar for the business sessions, and to make any other arrangements that are necessary for the conduct of the Conference. The Conference Committee shall announce the Annual Conference at least two (2) months previous to the date of the meeting. It shall publish the Annual Report of the AFLC.
- 13. The manuscript for the Annual Report shall be kept on file by the secretary for at least two (2) years after the publication of the report. The president and secretary shall determine how much of the manuscript of the Annual Report shall be kept on permanent file.
- 14. The Secretary shall send notices to all concerned as to resolutions passed by the Annual Conference, election of committees, etc., by September 1.
- 15. These Rules for Work may be amended in the following manner: A motion to make an amendment shall be presented in writing to the Annual Conference and shall be voted upon at the following Annual Conference. For the adoption of the motion, a two-thirds majority of the ballots cast is required. All amendments must be in agreement with the Fundamental Principles, especially 5 and 10.
- 16. These Rules for Work of the AFLC shall take precedence over all other orders and decisions in effect.
