We have a Facebook page with over 500 friends and our Instagram has been set up. I can't thank you enough for being willing to write for me when called upon. We pray these publications are helpful on a practical level; but most of all, pray that they always point you to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

We work diligently to update the Resource Manual. Do you know where your church's copy is? Information in the WMF Resource Manual is not copyrighted so copies can be made as needed. We also hope you have seen our Promotional DVD. If not, you can view this at <a href="https://www.aflc.org/women">www.aflc.org/women</a>.

My heart is full as I picture the women across the AFLC in their WMF meetings. It has been over 59 years of women meeting to pray, give and "go ye into all the world." With gifts given to the various ministries we bless the workers in the harvest fields. This year your contributions are disbursed for these areas.

Christian Education: Parish Ed, Free Lutheran Bible College (FLBC), Free Lutheran Seminary (FLS)

<u>Parish Ed</u>; Support received goes towards printing volume six of the AFLC Heritage Series, an AFLC history written by Pastor Robert Lee. Pray for Director Marian Christopherson and the Board of Publications.

<u>FLBC</u>: The FLBC funds will continue to cover dorm improvements. Pray for our student body, and staff, Dean Rev. Adam Osier and the FLBC school board.

<u>FLS</u>: Supporting each full-time seminarian and intern with \$100 each semester for books, a Lutheran Ambassador subscription, and the remaining funds toward scholarships. Pray for our seminary and Dean Dr. James Molstre and the FLS school board.

At this point we also want to remind you that we have a resource for you to use for parents of new babies. Our Cradle Roll packets contain biblically-sound brochures with encouragement to raise a child in the Word of God. Packets can be ordered through WMF Executive Secretary, Dawn Johnson.

#### **World Missions**

Contributions will be distributed toward missionaries' monthly support at the discretion of the members of the World Missions Board. Pray for our missionaries and their families, Director Pastor Earl Korhonen and the World Missions Board.

#### **Home Missions**

Support received goes toward the underwriting of the Church Planting Retreat; we also pledge to support the summer teams. The remainder given will be used at the discretion of the Home Missions Board as deemed necessary. Pray for our home mission churches, pastors, wives, their families and church planting assistants. Also keep the Home Missions Board in your prayers.

#### **General Fund**

The general operating fund also needs your offerings of support in order for the National Board to continue the work of the WMF. Operating expenses include: printing and mailing newsletters (Helping Hand), resource manual updates, welcome packets, salary of the executive secretary, stipend for the president and treasurer, convention expenses, on-line meeting expenses, office equipment and supplies as well as WOC (women's outreach coordinator) travel. At this time our board members are meeting this need and there is some money still available from a grant designated towards this. Every effort is made to keep these expenses as reasonable as possible. This year we are grateful for a grant to cover printing expenses. We have been able to share at several Re-awakening conferences. We want it to be impossible for ladies not to know about WMF... Women's Ministry is alive and well across the AFLC. Thanks be to God!

#### WMF DAY SUMMARY 2021

WMF Theme – Guard What Has Been Entrusted To You (1 Timothy 6:20-21) Theme Hymn – "I Stand Amazed" AH 540

One hundred-eight-seven women registered for the Women's Missionary Federation Day on June 16, 2021 at the Association Free Lutheran Schools, in Plymouth, MN. Lavonne West, President of the National WMF opened the day with a welcome and prayer. Ruth Rautio President of the Minneapolis District WMF, gave a welcome to the women and Tamba Abel gave a greeting from the church and women in Brazil.

Bible study writer, Mrs. Jeanette Berntson, shared devotions based on the WMF, "Guard the Deposit" from Timothy 6:21-21. Jeanette shared how the "deposit" (God's Word) which we have been given, has not changed, and that we need to keep its message until Jesus comes again, much like a soldier does. We are not to add to the deposit or to remove anything from it.

After Jeanette's devotions, a praise and worship time was led by the 2021 Ambassadors.

**Workshop 1** was presented by Mrs. Marian Christopherson along with PE & Publications board members Leeanna Lunn, and Susan Tietjen. Leeanna presented a lesson from a handout based on the new Ten Commandments Sunday School materials. Marian shared the What, Why and Then for being "Entrusted for Entrusting" in regards to the Gospel. They also presented some specials regarding books and materials available from their department.

**Workshop 2** was presented by Mrs. Mary Ann Ward. She spoke on "We too, Must guard What Has Been Entrusted to Us", reminding the women about the responsibilities involved in guarding and protecting what has been given to us. We are to guard God's Word and make sure we 'keep it's teachings pure' and be aware of any false teachings. Mary Ann had the ladies meet in small groups and share false messages that we are dealing with in our world. We need to protect our families and churches.

During the offering time, a missionary video was played with greetings from all AFLC missionaries; (offering boxes were stationed in back areas with no offering baskets passed).

Jan Strand led a memorial service based on 1 Thessalonians, reminding us that we do not grieve as those who have no hope. Jan shared promises of hope through various hymns having the ladies sing the choruses after each promise. She read about 38 ladies names as sent in from various WMF's to be remembered.

After lunch the ladies were welcomed back with learning the song "Come People of the Risen King", led by Anne Presteng.

**Workshop 3** - "Guard the Treasure", by Rebecca Moan, began with her testimony and some nostalgic pictures from her young farm life. She reminded all ladies that we can only guard the treasure with the Holy Spirits help. Rebecca had several young ladies from her church (Alaina Rautio and Hannah Mobley) share scripture verses they memorized. Rebecca also had one of the FLBC teams share a VBS song, "It's True".

Following Workshop 3, the women broke into prayer groups and prayed for the 2021 Prayer List: AFLC leaders; WMF Officers; Home & World Missions; Missionaries; Christian Education departments (Parish Education and the AFLC Schools).

Total offering for WMF day was \$3685. Offering was designated to be split between Christian Education (PE & Schools) and General Fund of the WMF.

After a stretch break, door prizes were given out and the business session began.

#### AFLC NATIONAL WOMEN'S MISSIONARY FEDERATION BUSINESS MEETING

President Lavonne West called the women to order for the WMF Day business session held Wednesday afternoon at the AFLC Schools new Student Life center gymnasium. She opened with prayer and shared designations for offerings. WMF Day to Christian Education and WMF General Fund, with the Mission Service offering going to WM and HM. The 2020 President's report was reviewed with highlights read.

MSC to receive the Presidents report.

The 2020 Recording Secretary report was reviewed by Karen Floan with highlights given; MSC to receive the Recording Secretary report.

Treasurer's report was shared by Margie Lee. MSC to receive the treasurer's report.

#### **Old Business:**

An amendment change to the constitution was MSC to ratify the change. It reads, "Newly elected officers shall officially assume their duties at the All Boards meeting following their election."

#### **New Business:**

Discussion on last years suggestion to update names of AFLBS to FLBC and AFLTS to FLS in the constitution as friendly amendments. Ruth Rautio suggested to add wording after each: FLBC (formerly known as AFLBS) and FLS (formerly known as AFLTS).

Discussion on proposal of suggested change for WMF Zones. MSC to use just one zone and go with the suggested zone rotation for the four giving projects.

Treasurer Margie Lee presented the 2020-2022 report with proposed and actual budget. Income for WM, HM and Christian ED would be given as received and not included in the proposed budget for \$60,650. MSC to accept.

Nominations for President and Communication Secretary. The following were elected unanimously:

President - Mrs. Lavonne West

Communication Secretary – Mrs. Linda (Papillon) Hensrud, Grafton, ND

The 2021 WMF Resolutions were presented. It was MSC to accept them. Thanks to the WMF committees who served for 2021.

The 2022 Resolutions Committee and 2022 Nominating Committee were announced.

A thank you was given to outgoing WMF officer Deanna Larson.

The business session was adjourned. Rev. Robert L. Lee who presided as parliamentarian gave the benediction and closing.

\*Following the WMF Business meeting the Advisory Committee met (which consisted of NWMF Board and district representatives). The day was reviewed and ideas and comments shared.

#### No WMF Breakfast took place in 2021.

#### **Mission Festival Service 2021**

The 2021 FLBC Ambassadors gave a prelude of songs, and Mrs. Marian Christopherson was pianist. WMF President Lavonne West began the service by welcoming everyone. Pastor Earl Korhonen, World Missions Director led the service and opened with prayer followed by having the audience sing hymn "Lift High the Cross".

The WM Missionary Video greeting was presented with all the attending missionaries recognized.

Home Missions Director Pastor James L. Johnson presented two churches that have graduated from HM status, (Village Bay in AK and Immanuel Lutheran of Springfield, MO).

Special music was presented by the McCarlson family.

The evening message was given by missionary Rev. Jonathan Abel based on Psalm 126:1-6, Joys and trials in service to the Lord. Pastor Abel shared several stories of lives transformed by Christ in Brazil as well as hard-ships encountered.

Due to concerns over COVID offering was not taken, but baskets were placed in the back of the auditorium. Total offering for the evening was \$3216 (\$1608 to World Missions and \$1608 to Home Missions).

The service closed with singing the WMF Theme Hymn - "I stand Amazed", followed by the Lord's Prayer and benediction.

Pie was served following the service to honor retiring schools faculty Rev. Robert L. Lee.

Thank you to the Association Free Lutheran Schools for hosting so graciously and providing for our needs during the conference. The next WMF day will be held in June 2022 at the Association Retreat Center in Osceola, WI.
