FORGIVENESS

"Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." Ephesians 4:32 (NIV)

Sometimes we seasoned Christians gloss over verses like this one. We've heard it so many times! The words *kind*, *compassionate*, and *for-giveness* are mentioned in our daily devotionals, in the sermons we hear, and in verses we've memorized. But let's slow down a little and meditate on the word *forgiveness* for a few minutes.

Merriam-Webster tells us that the word *forgive* means to stop feeling angry or resentful to someone for an offense, flaw, or mistake; to cancel (a debt). A basic tenet of our faith is that we are forgiven of our sin because of Jesus' work on the cross. By believing and trusting in Jesus, we are no longer separated from God Almighty! Praise God that we are forgiven!

After reading a verse or hearing a sermon, we often walk away wondering how to apply it to our life. When we apply forgiveness, we often picture something big: a co-worker, neighbor, or family member does or says something that hurts us. At some point the offender approaches us with remorse, asks our forgiveness, and we graciously grant it, never to stir it up again. We sometimes think of forgiveness as an 'event'.

But as we study Colossians 3:13, "...Forgive as the Lord forgave you.", we see there is more to the picture. Has the Lord Jesus only forgiven us for sins we've specifically confessed? Does He only forgive what we think of as 'big' sins? Or does he forgive us completely, for sins both large and small, and for simply being a person tainted by sin?

Maybe a more realistic picture of forgiveness be this: a coworker makes a hurtful comment under their breath, a neighbor is unkind, a family member excludes us from an event and whether they are aware of the hurt they've caused or not, we graciously forgive them, no matter if the sin was big or small, even if they don't ask for forgiveness, even if we're offended, and then graciously carry on treating them with kindness and love? Instead of an event, a Christ-follower sees forgiveness as an attitude, a lifestyle, only to be

lived out by the power of the Holy Spirit. Do you see the difference?

Does this not mirror our relationship with God through His Son, Jesus Christ? We continually receive forgiveness for thoughts, words, and deeds that are offensive to God's holiness so therefore we should likewise continually be forgiving others.

Sisters in Christ, will you take several minutes to meditate on forgiveness, both the forgiveness we've received and that which we extend to others? Let us pray with new and firm conviction "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." (Matthew 6:11)



Fall is almost here which means the start of a new school year.

We are excited to bring back 14 returning students, three new students, and two interns. Our two interns, Mikey Meester and Troy Hanson are doing well in Stanley and Williston North Dakota. They are learning Pastor Pastoral ministry from Erin Tormanen and Jon Wellumson. Our three new students are currently in class studying Greek every morning for two weeks. They are taking a refresher course to be sure they are ready for fall classes. Teaching them is our new faculty member Dr. Jarrod Hylden. Dr. Hylden has a passion for Biblical languages and loves to impart his gift to the students. Our new Students are Matthew Baerbock his wife Sara and ten children from the Living Word congregation in Eagan Minnesota, Benjamin Nordvik his wife Nicole and three children from Grace Free Lutheran in Bagley Minnesota and Luke Dryburgh and his wife Reise most recently from Fertile/Beltrami Minnesota.

Large families seem to be the trend in our seminary recently. Not counting the interns we have a total of 78 family members in our Junior, Middler, and Senior classes. Of those 78, 41 are children with six newborns in the past year.

Dr. Hylden mentioned above is married with five children. He and his wife Elise moved into the Jerry Moan house in Corcoran after the Moans accepted the call to serve the McIntosh congregations. Dr. Jason Gudim also accepted a call to serve as full-time faculty. He and his wife Esther have five children with the first attending Bible College this fall.

While so much changes every new school year, much remains the same. Our students will be taught the Word of God and how to minister in the congregation. They will learn the importance of caring for the souls of each member. And by God's grace they will have a Pastor's heart.

- 8-The Light of the World: The Invitation.
- **9-**The Light that Directs.
- **10-**The Light that Transforms: Becoming Sons of Light.
- **11**-The Light that Abides: Living the De-Vine Life

While learning the process of downloading our weekly programs, I thought for sure I would never get it. Now 3 months later it's the easiest part of the iob.

A couple of goals of mine are to develop a high school basketball sports program for the area and a music/scripture program. A new addition for us is officially being able to stream KAKN online at our website KAKN.org. Until now, KAKN has only been heard in the Bristol Bay area. We are very excited to share this part of the Alaska Mission ministry with those in the "lower 48" and gain new listeners!

Outside of my work at KAKN, I've enjoyed and been encouraged by getting to know my new church family, helping with Sunday School, hosting teams that visited this summer, going to the beach, seeing bears, and checking out the local library! At times it can be hard to gauge how much of an impact serving has, but 1 Corinthians 15:58 says, "Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain." That's a good reminder for the team up here, and hopefully an encouragement for you as you serve your families, churches, and communities. 
Executive Secretary Position
