Though the order of worship may vary in our congregations, we offer the following suggestions:

Opening Hymn / Worship Team: Hymns and/or Praise Songs of Gratefulness (i.e. "Now Thank We All Our God")

**Confession of Sin and Absolution:** Acknowledging the Word's authority, consider using Scripture for both. (i.e. Psalm 32:5; Psalm 51:3,4; 1 John 1:9) Following these, consider having the congregation pray the Lord's Prayer, thus uniting our need for God's forgiveness with our need to forgive others.

Scripture Readings: Consider using readers of different generations. (i.e. senior citizen – Psalm 37:23-26; youth – 2 Timothy 3:14-17; middle age - John 17:13-21

**Confession of Faith:** In addition to one of the Creeds, a personal testimony thanking God for how He has used the AFLC in that person's life would provide a powerful witness to the.

Special Music: If you have a present or former AFLBS student, consider asking them to share in song and testimony.

**Pulpit Hymn:** "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God"
