This step may take significant time if your listening habits depend on iPods, mp3 players, and online sources. If you are not familiar with radios, most cars have one as do many alarm clocks. Got one? Nope, that's an 8-track player – sell that on eBay. Now do you have it? Don't read on until you do.

Tune it to 99.9 FM. What do you hear? Is it an actual station playing music or is it just static?

Where I live it is an actual station playing Christian music. Now, picture I am listening to this station in my car near my home in Minnesota. The urge hits me to see a friend in North Dakota, so I hit the road. After about an hour of driving towards Fargo, my solid music from a Biblical worldview will turn into that ever attractive hum of static.

Like a radio, when it comes to God's Word, it is a matter of tuning in.

Josiah got one of the biggest gifts an eight year-old has ever received – he was made king. Not king for a day. No, he didn't win a radio contest. Josiah was actually made King of Judah.

Plus this kid did not take God's Word lightly. In Second Chronicles 34, Josiah sought the Lord as a teenager (v. 3). By the time he was about twenty, he was cleaning house – removing idols in the land, and later, King Jo sent people to reset the house of God (v. 8).

While the workers were doing their duties, they found the book of the law and brought it to the king (v. 14-18). When Josiah heard it, he tore his clothes (v. 19) – he was tuned in to see it was time to repent. Later, the king read the book of the law for everyone to hear it (v. 30).

The One true Living God has spoke to us in His Word. Like a radio station broadcasting its frequency, the Lord has announced the truth about our sin and His grace through faith in Jesus. But also like a radio station, we can ignore it. It can simply be background noise. Are you listening? Are you tuning in to truth?

66 The student missions trip this past July and August was no doubt the best way I could have spent my summer. I grew up in Campo Morao as a missionary kid, but I have been living in the U.S. for the past six years or so. I have known Paul and Becky since I was about three. I had a great time seeing them, my friends, and the places where I grew up. The first thing I noticed when I arrived in Bateias was how warm the people were. After church services, almost everybody would shake our hands, give us hugs, and thank us for coming. The people would invite us over for food and be generous with whatever they had.

There were many things that I didn't remember since living there. Because I am older now, I was able to see more of the struggles the church in Brazil has. Brazil has an enormous number of Roman Catholics (though most are nonpracticing). When someone leaves that church, that person is shunned by the whole family in most cases. There is often a fear of becoming a Christian. Not only for the loss of place in the family, but in truly repenting from their worldly ways. Pastor Paul told us that it takes 16 years to really establish a church in order to maintain a stable congregation.

The whole trip really opened my eyes more to see how much of a need there is for missionaries. There are only two of our missionary families in Brazil now, and few other [AFLC] missionaries in other parts of the world. I would strongly recommend any Christian, who is serious about God, go on a missions trip and see how God might open your eyes to missions."

he mission trip to Brazil was a great opportunity for me. It was a time of spiritual maturation, social maturation, fellowship, and learning of all sorts. It was great to see how God works in people five thousand miles away, who don't even speak the same language as me. Believers truly do have an immediate relationship, and it is obviously not bound by language.

It was also awesome to simply be in the Word constantly (you can do that anywhere, I guess) and being at five services every week. That deepened the relationship I have with Christ. Being in a fresh environment took it to a different level, because it was WAY away from the daily routine. That seems to make it easier to really get focused. Seeing the culture and being so far from home helped me to grow up a little bit, too, which is always helpful. Getting to know the team, the Abels, and all of the Brazilian folks was also a great experience.

I could ramble all day about every detail about this mission trip, but the truth is that you can't really know where I'm coming from until you experience it for yourself. So, I strongly encourage everyone, regardless of future plans for missions, to go on one of these trips to really get the full effect and see just how awesome it is. Praise God!"


