# Conquering Grit Hill

Motivation was high as I laced up my shoes and stretched before beginning my morning run. The first mile was easy, my pace perfectly in sync with Toby Mac's *Eye on it*. Then, like clockwork, I felt my heart fumble and breathing shallow as I prepared for my nemesis a half-mile ahead. It has earned a name in my lexicon: Grit Hill. And there it was before me at the 1.5-mile mark daring me to conquer its summit yet again.

I think a career in youth ministry can be much like facing Grit Hill. In my first years I had the strength and stamina to keep up with the rigors of student ministry. However, fifteen years down the road my perspective had changed. I was no longer young, cool and relevant and my son and his classmates were in my junior high group: total game changer. I was disappointed that some parents and even staff saw "church" as a checklist to complete rather than an opportunity to disciple our young people. The distance between reality and my expectations formed an everwidening gulf. The question loomed, "Do I have the grit required for the long haul in youth ministry?"

Today I find myself pushing through forty and my son graduating from high school in May. To make it up my career equivalent of Grit Hill I learned that I can't do ministry alone. I need other youth workers to learn from as we run the race building healthy youth ministry together. If you are starting out in youth ministry full of energy and confidence, that's awesome! Enjoy that season of life, but there's a storm coming and you *will* run into trials. When they come, is there someone in your life pouring into you? Are there other youth workers in your community with whom you are collaborating, praying, and resourcing?

A basic principal Christ taught us was to lead from an overflow. The Father poured into him and he in turn poured into others. We need to take time in prayer and God's Word. He also modeled doing ministry in community.



In Kara Powell's book *Sticky Faith,* she challenges us to build a constellation of five mentors around our young people if we want to give them a shot at a faith that sticks beyond high school. The same could be said of achieving success for the long haul in youth ministry! Do you have five older, wiser youth workers pouring into your life? Do you have peers with whom you sharpen one another? Who are the Timothies in your youth ministry who you are pouring into?

I have yet to make it through Grit Hill without my lungs feeling like they are on fire, but each time I run the hill the fire isn't as intense. The reason I keep at it is because I want to be healthy and I have other runners who are encouraging me along. Likewise, surround yourself with people who can help make you a healthy youth worker. You can find a network near you by visiting youthworkers.net and if there are none near you, why not start one? I will be there to help encourage you along as you build a healthy network.



## Oh...My Soul: God's Delight!

It was one of those lasting images you get after a large concert or your favorite sporting event.

At one of the national youth network conventions that I attended, the organizers had a brilliant idea. They honored in front of 4,000 youth leaders Sometimes we focus on delivering God's truths so one volunteer that had been actively serving teenagers for over 40 years. Now in her late sixties or early seventies, a shocked smile climbed across her face as she stepped on stage without being aware of the honor about to be bestowed. Her name and service was called out and the thunderous applause began from the priesthood of believers.

This moment came back to my mind when I read the following verse:

You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate, but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the Lord delights in you, and your land shall be married. - Isaiah 62:4

We tell teenagers consistently (and correctly!) about the reality of our sin and the powerful grace of Jesus Christ. They sometimes shrug their shoulders at the incredible truths of Scripture, because within themselves and within their world, all they know is rejection. But you know God's Word, so you continue to proclaim the excellencies of Christ (I Peter 2:9).

much that we skip God's truths delivering us. Sometimes we lavish God's love on others without pausing to receive God's love through others. Sometimes we exhaust ourselves cheering others on that we forget that the One sending us is cheering us on.
