

When You Pray

Jesus was approached by His disciples in Luke 11. The Savior King had just been praying, so the disciples thought it was a good time to talk about it. Hearing John the Baptist had taught his followers about this incredible conversation with our Heavenly Father, they thought it wise to ask.

Very likely they expected a teaching about prayer. What they first received was itself a prayer.


Jesus started in verse two with “When you pray, say”. The words that followed in verses 2-4 are the content of the Lord’s Prayer. Studying the Lord’s Prayer is valuable. Such a study is worthy of our time, but today we are focusing on some details around prayer.

GETTING STARTED

One of the things that we should note is that Jesus expected prayer would be an active part of a believer’s life. The three little words “When you pray” indicate that it would be a normal activity. Jesus doesn’t make a case that you should pray. Instead, the Lord expresses that ongoing conversation with your Heavenly Father will be a natural outcome of this supernatural relationship.

The Redeemer of the world went on to stress in this chapter that the Father is good and so His answers are good (v. 5-13). Therefore, we are motivated to come to the great God Almighty, who can be trusted.



OUT LOUD? REALLY?!?

I was a teen at a Bible Camp one year after coming to assurance of salvation. I had offered to assist the program leaders for some weeks and the Lord was teaching me many things from His Word. I had grown in times of prayer, but do not recall being asked in a public setting to pray. At the end of one chapel, immediately after a humorous skit and its explanation, the leader called, “Jason, would you close our time in prayer?” Friends nearby later described that I went from a laughing smile to pursed lips in 0.91 seconds! I stood up, fumbled through some words, and ended.

"What was that?" I asked myself.

I realized that I was thinking more about what others around me heard than what the One to whom I was praying heard. I was planning out what I said, instead of talking with my Abba Father. As you grow in prayer, there will be moments that you get distracted or discouraged. Remember God's heart to hear from His children....to hear from you!



GETTING TOGETHER

One challenge that a number of teens have expressed to me is that they are comfortable praying alone, but it gets awkward praying with others in their congregation or at their school. Acts 2:42 reminds us that the early church prioritized praying together: "**And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.**" In fact, this structure suggests a regular and consistent coming together seeking the Lord in prayer.

Who in your congregation could you pray with on a weekly basis at Sunday School or youth group? Who in your school could you connect with to pray at lunch for one another?

ALWAYS? REALLY?!?

The other question that I sometimes hear raised around the environment of prayer comes from First Thessalonians 5:17 – "**pray without ceasing**".

How is that possible? How can I always be in prayer? I know that I prayed all the way through that last Chemistry test, but am I truly to be praying every moment that I am awake?

When you move from seeing prayer as only the formal, sit-down, meal-time settings and move to understanding this ongoing conversation with your Heavenly Father, then the "without ceasing" develops. Whether walking the hallway or during an extra-curricular activity, you can talk to the Lord. Let's join together in praying for one another, our congregations, and our communities.

In Jesus' Name, AMEN.


