



The following four AFLBS students are in an advanced youth ministry class that AFLC Youth Ministries' Pastor Jason Holt teaches. Through the fall semester, these students along with a number of fellow students served as the planning team for the program of both the Association Retreat Center's Winter Retreats – SIDExSIDE and Sno Daze. Both retreats gathered under the theme "Declare." This experience got them thinking about settings in which they have been invited to "declare" Jesus Christ and Him crucified, to declare the content of who the Lord is, or have been on the receiving end of His message. They share their reflections here to encourage you as you demonstrate the truth and love of Jesus to those around you.

"To declare" is to openly align oneself for or against in a dispute. Today's teens are living in a society that is all about declaring who they are as a person. Additionally, many struggle with their declaration as a Christian and what they truly believe. Psalm 96 provides the ultimate direction to "..Declare His glory among the nations, His marvelous works among all the peoples!" The command is to tell others of our great and wonderful Savior! So, how can this be done?

Psalm 96 points out some ideas of how to declare what is important. First, notice verses 4-5 state that God is to be feared above all gods. "...For all gods of the peoples are worthless idols." God created the heavens! He is the Creator and is not like the man-made gods of this world because He is not made -- He just was, is, and is to come. Second, from verse 10, the focus is on the familiar words, "The LORD reigns!" God is the King of kings who established the world and will judge our actions. He stands for the ultimate truth, judging with right-eousness and justice. Lastly, verses 11-13 proclaim the most anticipated event: Christ's return. Creation will be glad and joyful, and will rejoice, roar, and exult at this marvelous event. This is the story to proclaim with certainty, and to declare for all to hear!

It was my senior year in high school and my brother Jacob and I were flying standby to Hawaii. Our first flight took off at 6:30 in the morning. It was going to go to Phoenix, but we didn't end up leaving until the next day at 10, because our flight got canceled. It was actually a really cool situation, because while I was in the airplane I was able to minister to three elderly ladies who were on their way to Hawaii for a girls week out. I started my conversation on takeoff asking them if they enjoyed flying. All three were terrified of the experience, so through that one little question I was able to do two things: guide the conversation into spiritual matters and ask them about their relationship with Christ. This conversation about spiritual things led to asking whether or not they believed they were saved. I was able to distract them from the takeoff and the flight, and even better, I could talk about Jesus!



When I was a junior in high school, some friends and I went to New York with the intention of doing street ministry with a larger organization called Spread Truth. I really enjoyed this mission trip, but especially one day. We were in Harlem and we had a prayer station setup. We had pamphlets and some of the pamphlets had blown away due to wind and we didn't think anything of it at the time. About 3 hours later we stopped in to eat at a restaurant, and the lady across the table had one of the pamphlets that had blown away. On the cover of this particular pamphlet that she was holding it said "God gives Grace." We noticed after a couple moments of looking at her that she was crying. After seeing this, we walked over to her to investigate and ask her how she was doing. We let her know that we were the ones handing out the pamphlets and asked if there was anything we can do for her. She told us that her daughter had cancer and she just today heard that her daughter's cancer had miraculously gone away with no reason behind it.

The story hits me for many reasons, but my favorite part of it is realizing how much I didn't do. God was the one that made the pamphlet fly away and fall into her hands. But if we hadn't been there declaring the gospel on that street with those pamphlets at all, it would have never found her, and she would have never accepted Christ that day.



Kings Kaleidoscope "Playing with Fire" (Live in Between) ft. Propaganda


What do you get when you mix 1 gal. of creativity, 6 cups of musicianship, 3 ta-


MOVIE: "Paul: Apostle of Christ"
